WORK STARTED ON DISTILLING PLANT

VANCOUVER, Wash., July 26.—(AP)—Work had been started here today on a distilling plant which the operators say will cost \$100,000 and will use apples, pears, prunes, and potatoes in the production of brandies and wines.

The Columbia Wine & Distillery company is building the plant about three miles north of Vancouver. The first unit, of concrete, will be three stories high and about 40 by 90 feet in dimension. The second unit, housing the rectifying plant, will be built next year. The first distillery unit will be ready this fall. Fresh fruits will be used in season, and dried fruit will be used at other times.

PUNCH BOARD RACKET FAILS TO WORK HERE

A new cheating racket has put in an appearance here. 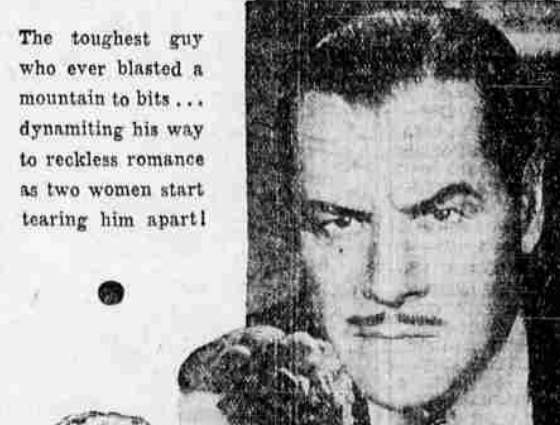
