## UNSINKABLE SHIP INVENTION CLAIM PORTLAND VENDOR

for miles around, the Vickford-Smith munitions factory at Taino blew up this afternoon taking an estimated toll of 50 lives.

Many girls were working in the plant and it was feared they were included among the dead. Scores of workers were injured.

Officials of the factory and municipalities refused to answer questions concerning the explosion.

Villagers, however, expressed the opinion the first blast occurred in the packing warehouse. They said many girls were working in that building.

The families of the approximately five hundred employees of the plant hovered around the outskirts of the factory grounds until late at night, awaiting reports from squadrons of militiamen who were rushed to the scene.
