

Charity Gifts of Corporations Not Exempted, But Profits From Gold Mines May Be.

WASHINGTON, July 30 - (AP) - The new \$275,000,000 tax bill was formally

approved today by the house ways and means committee.

Chairman Doughton, (D. N. C.), hoped to get the measure up on the floor tomorrow. He said that if he falled it would be taken up "Thursday at the latest."

"I hope we can get it passed by Saturday," Doughton added, "It we don't we certainly can get it through by Monday."

The bill includes new taxes on in-

heritances and gifts, in addition to those already levied on estates and gifts, increases taxes on individual incomes and corporation excess prof-its and graduated levies on corporation net incomes.

Indications were that republican members of the ways and means committee would file a majority report critisizing the bill because of the contention it would do nothing worth while toward balancing the budget.

There had been reconstituted. There had been forecasts that an

attempt would be made in the com-mittee to permit corporations to de-duct from their taxable income gifts made to community chests and chari-table organizations not operated for profit. This did not materialize. Today's committee session lasted less than 15 minutes. Committee democrats, however, aiready had spent about two weeks working on the bill in secret session from which the re-

publicans were excluded. As the bill was reported. Represen-As the bill was reported, Represen-tative Scrugham (D. Nev.), made pub-lic an amendment which will he will propose from the floor to deduct from corporation income money de-rived from the mining of gold.
