CLEVELAND, Aug. 3.—(AP)—Mrs. Louise Schaffer Bauer, 25, stood with her husband today as she bade farewell to her brutally slain bridegroom of less than a month, Dr. Walter J. Bauer, at brief services in a funeral home.

Returning with members of her husband's family after interment rites in Calvary cemetery, the young widow prepared to depart for Chicago to face her childhood sweetheart, Manderville Zenge, 26, questioned in connection with the mutilation-slaying of Bauer.

Chicago authorities requested Mrs. Bauer to return directly, by plane if necessary, in the belief that sight of the pretty brunette nurse will break down Zenge's persistent denial of complicity in the crime.

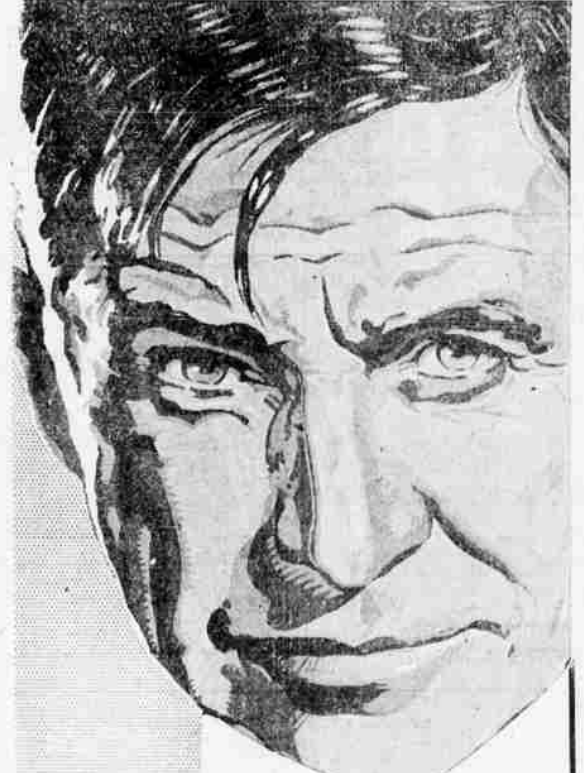
