



### ROGUES DEFEATED 4-2 BY COQUILLE TO EVEN HONORS

#### Locals Suffer Through Bad Breaks — Third Game Scheduled On Fairgrounds Diamond Next Sunday.

The breaks were against the Medford Rogues at Coquille yesterday, and the Loggers felled them and skidded them into the sawmill of a 4-2 beating to avenge a Rogue victory at the start of the season, one of only two defeats suffered by the Coquille nine in 23 games. Next Sunday at the fairgrounds here the Rogues will get another crack at the Loggers however, and they swear that the breaks can't always be against them. One instance of the way the wind blew yesterday came in the sixth, with the score tied at 2-all. "Emp" Nullifies Run Swanson was on second, and a hot hit by Arnie sent him galloping around the circuit, to come in at home well ahead of a frantic heave from the outfield. And the umpire ruled that Swanson in his flight had ignored the third sack. This was vigorously denied by Swanson, the rest of the Rogues, and a goodly percentage of the crowd, but the umpire was adamant.

The Rogues turned in one of the greatest games of their careers, and the contest was said to be the best and fastest ever held in the coast city. It was over in exactly one hour and 26 minutes. When the game started, there was a sparse, and not too enthusiastic crowd. As the battle progressed, word leaked out that an unusual ball game was going on and before the end of the fifth, the park was jammed. Many will come to Medford Sunday in the hopes of seeing another such fracas. Bauman of Medford pitched beautiful ball, striking out 10 Loggers while Brewer for Coquille was whiffing 12 Medford sluggers. The Rogues played against two of their old team mates in Sowers and Woodard. As a salutation, Sowers hammered one of Bauman's offerings over the nickel seats for the only home run of the day.

#### Circus Catches Hurt

Sensational circus catches of seemingly impossible drives piled up an advantage for the Loggers that the Rogues couldn't overcome. The game was so hotly contested all the way that the final outcome was not certain till the gun went off, with the Medford nine working nicely. Bouchard and Walton, catcher and first sacker from the Timber league in Washington, who have been in a zott-ball playoff at Bellingham for the past several weeks, came down for the game, meeting the Medford squad at the junction just south of Roseburg, and both played nice games. They will be here for the Coquille invasion Sunday.

As the storm roared inland streams were flooded and numerous villages were completely submerged. Another similar storm was reported approaching.

### BEGLE RODEO THRILLS, BELLINGHAM BOY STATE GOLF KING

With Queen Della Malby of Trail looking on, the Begle rodeo held yesterday at the Brown ranch was voted so successful that it was decided to hold a bigger and better one on Labor Day at the same place on Sunday, September 1, and Monday, September 2. Over 500 yelling spectators watched as Ralph Pender on Barney Google, Bert Gunner on Neverquit, Harvey Mitchell on Tracy and C. E. Knutson, a professional, on two different horses gave the crowd a thrilling exhibition of bronco-busting, non-fishing, plain bucking, kicking, stiff-leg jolts and all the other tricks in the bag failed to dislodge the riders, even though some of the horses were wild and had never before been under a saddle. Ed Johnson, who also rode horses, sustained the only casualty of the day when a madly plunging steer threw him, dislocating his shoulder. Four or five others rode without being tossed.

C. E. Gillette was foreman of the rodeo. Queen Della, riding a string of her own ponies, did exhibition riding that had the crowd on its feet time and again. She has announced her intention of riding in the Lakeview and Pendleton round-ups later in the year. After about three hours of general rodeo exhibits, the crowd retired to the Brown dance pavilion, where the cowboys were all forced to take off their chaps and spurs before being allowed on the floor. The festivities lasted until midnight. The Brown pavilion is becoming increasingly popular as a center of Begle social life.

Pete Belcastro, fiery Italian wrestler will meet Sam Lethers of Texas in one of the double main event matches Thursday night at the Armory. It was made known today, but he refused to put up his belt for the Pacific Coast Junior Heavyweight championship. Awful Al Karasick, veteran Russian tendon twister, will meet popular Les Wolfe in the other main event tussle.
