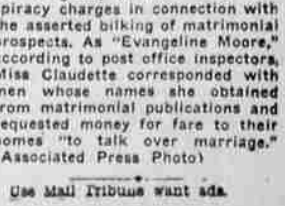

RUNT GUNMAN OF JOLIET ESCAPES

JOLIET, Illinois, Aug. 5.—(AP)—Henry 'Midget' Pernekes, 38, diminutive quick-shooting gunman accused of at least five murders and a dozen bank robberies, was missing from his cell in the state penitentiary today. Officials said he apparently had escaped by donning civilian clothing and walking past the guards as a visitor.

Pernekes was serving a 10 year life sentence for the robbery of the Inland Trust and Savings bank in Chicago.

The gunman, who was given the name 'Midget' because of his size—he was five feet three inches tall and weighed 140 pounds—was missed during a daily check of prisoners.
