TACOMA MILL SUFFERS HEAVY LOSS BY BLAZE

TACOMA, Aug. 7.—(AP)—A loss of from a million to a million and a quarter dollars was suffered early this morning by the Wheeler Oaxwood plant here when a fire broke out in one of the veneer driers and spread rapidly under the flooring in the sander dust that had filtered through the floor boards.

The area covered by the fire is about 1/2 acres and includes the veneer, plywood and hardwood plants. The company had just started working on a 24-hour schedule with the largest crew since 1932. The company's drier plant was not affected and will continue to run.
