

MARGINAL LAND BUYING ASSURED IN WESTERN AREA

WASHINGTON, Aug. 16.—(AP)—Wide-spread purchase of sub-marginal agricultural lands in the Rocky Mountain west and their retirement from cultivation was virtually assured today with quick senate action on the modified program proposed by the house.

Under a senate amendment by Sen-

ator Wheeler (D. Mont.) \$50,000,000 was authorized from the works fund for land purchases. This was changed by the house to authorize "such amount as the President may allow for the development of a national program of land cultivation and land utilization.

This proposal submitted by Chairman Jones (D. Tex.) of the house agricultural committee was adopted in lieu of the Wheeler amendment. The Wheeler amendment specified the money should be used only for purchase of lands now under option to the federal government. Senate agreement was expected today on the Jones amendment which he described as "very much a limitation of the senate amendment."

Representative Ayers (D. Mont.) introduced a separate bill authorizing expenditure of \$50,000,000 from the works fund but no action was taken

on his proposal after Wheeler succeeded in getting the same plan thru in the senate as an amendment to the farm act.

Jones explained his proposal limited the senate amendment in that it confers certain authority to the President and places a limitation on that power in that lands must be acquired for public purposes.

The Wheeler-Ayers proposals were introduced after Comptroller General McCarl ruled relief funds could not be used for purchase of sub-marginal lands. It was his plan to circumvent McCarl's ruling and permit the land purchase program to continue as planned.

TRIANGLE KILLER GLAD SHE DID IT

NEW YORK, Aug. 16.—(AP)—Mrs. Etta Relaman, who shattered a triangle by killing her husband's secretary, was quoted today by the Daily News as saying:

"I don't think anything I did was so terribly wrong. In fact, I think I'm glad."

The only regret expressed in jail by the 35-year-old matron, who saw her place being usurped by the youthful and pretty Virginia Seigh one-time show girl, was for her son, Elias.

"He'll be mine soon," she explained, "and I am afraid of what he will

think about this—particularly when I am not there to tell him the truth."

Police offered to bring her son to the Queens county jail today, but her reply was:

"I never want him to see me in prison."

Mrs. Relaman expressed confidence she would not remain long in the jail, where Ruth Snyder was held until her trial and execution for another triangle killing.

DR. SMERTENKO'S NERVES JANGLED

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 16.—(AP)—The belief that her nerves had been shattered by a Japanese military air force demonstration she had witnessed in Tokyo was advanced today by fellow passengers in accounting for the reported suicide of Dr. Clara Smertenko, 63, University of Oregon professor.

The woman was said to have leaped into the sea from the deck of the liner Taiyo Maru soon after the ship left Hongkong the night of July 20.

She was one of a party touring the Orient.

Mrs. Landberry Beck, one of Mrs. Smertenko's traveling companions, said the University of Oregon teacher suffered a nervous breakdown some time ago and had taken the sea trip for her health.

"She had served in Poland during the war," Mrs. Beck said, "and the Tokyo military demonstration caused a relapse, bringing back to her mind those terrible days of war."

ASHURST PROTESTS NAME IN WHO'S WHO

WASHINGTON, Aug. 16.—(AP)—Senator Ashurst of Arizona today agreed the facts of his life are public property but protested just the same.

He wrote to the editor of "Who's Who in America" that although he had objected to inclusion of his name in the book, "my attorneys have advised me that I am without remedy."

"Please be advised that if you include my name it will be done against my wishes and I desire that you do not send me a copy thereof."
