MRS. ARNOLD WINS DECIDING MATCH IN SPEEDY UPSET

Wife of Ballplayer Stages Comeback—Helen Jacobs Defeats Dorothy Round to Give Edge.

FOREST HILLS, N. Y., Aug. 17.—(AP)—Executing a swift, sensational reversal of form, America's women tennis stars rallied to sweep the last three singles matches of the Wightman cup tennis series with Great Britain today and keep possession of the international trophy for the fifth straight year.

QUEEN HELEN NOT TO ENTER FOREST HILLS CONTESTS

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 17.—(AP)—Another surprise decision by Helen Willis Moody, who only a few weeks ago acted on an impulse that led to her comeback victory at Wimbledon, today removed her from the ranks of prospective contenders for the national women's tennis crown at Forest Hills this year.

"I feel that I have had enough tournament tennis for this season," Mrs. Moody announced last night, less than 24 hours after she had indicated that she expected to leave for Forest Hills within a week.

The announcement came as a complete surprise to her legion of followers in California, who had looked forward with interest to her expected attempt to regain the national crown which she lost in the famous "default" match to Helen Jacobs in 1933.
