

## LUMBERMEN PLAN LABOR DAY PICNIC AT ELKS' GROUNDS

The 4-L committee representing employees of the Medford Corporation (formerly Owen-Oregon) announced today that another big Labor Day picnic, Monday, September 2, at 10:30 a.m., will be held this year for employees and invited guests at the Elks' picnic grounds. This will be the third annual picnic given by this organization. All former members and their families are invited to attend, not only for a good time but to renew acquaintances and talk over "old times". The picnics have been so successful in former years as to attract considerable attention among other 4-L organizations in both Oregon and Washington and a large attendance is expected. The picnic this year is being covered by a special field man from the 4-L headquarters and an illustrated write-up will be made in the 4-L magazine which will center considerable attention on this section of the country.

Those desiring to attend this picnic and who have no means of transportation are requested to phone 771 and leave their name and address, and transportation will be furnished.

Individuals will furnish their own lunches and service. The organization will furnish free coffee, cream and ice cream.

A complete program of athletics and sports has been arranged with suitable prizes again given this year by the enterprising merchants as an advertising feature, and who have given their wholehearted co-operation as in former years.

Following is a brief history of the 4-L given by local organization spokesmen, which is interesting: "Eighteen years ago, under auspices of the federal government, employers and employees of the western lumber industry were brought together and formed an industry institution. They named it the Loyal Legion of Loggers and Lumbermen, now commonly known as the 4-L."

"This pioneer industry organization of men and management, since 1917, has been striving against great odds to bring about a better understanding of wage and hour problems within a complex industry."

"Since 1917 the 4-L not only has set and maintained industry wage scales, but it is a matter of record that these minimum wage scales, agreed to by joint action of employers and employees, have been the only wage standards ever set up within the industry. Also they have been the highest standards anywhere in the world."

"This is the result of a united effort. The 4-L knows that while payrolls constitute buying power, they constitute costs as well. The product, not the employer, pays the wages, and it is the customer who fills the pay envelope. With no product and no customers there can be no work or wages."

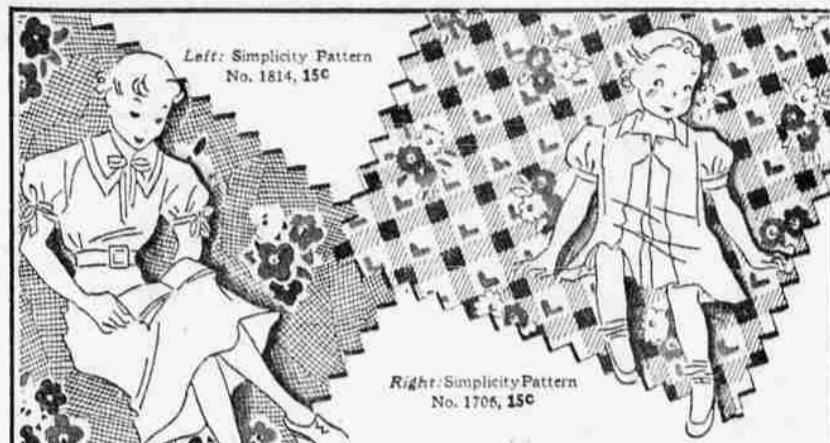

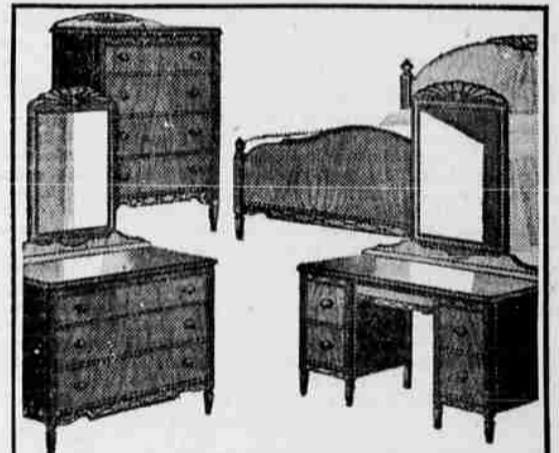
