## PACIFIC HIGHWAY ASKS FOURTH ALL 1936 ROAD MONEY

SALEM, Ore., Aug. 24.—(AP)—The Pacific Highway association, meeting here yesterday, went on record as favoring an allocation of one-fourth of all federal highway aid money for 1936 to the Pacific highway.

With C. H. Demaray of Grants Pass presiding, the group decided to raise funds through a membership campaign to establish an office in Salem for promoting improvement of the highway as the main artery of travel through the state.

Named on the fund-raising committee were: George Smith, Roseburg; C. E. Ingalls, Corvallis; Dr. Gerald Smith, Woodburn; and Fred Perrine, Oregon City. A fifth representative will be picked from the southern section of the highway.

SALEM, Ore., Aug. 24.—(AP)—State highway department officials were preparing an application today urging the federal government to permit skilled workmen on the Oregon Coast highway bridges to work 40 instead of 30 hours a week.

Officials argued that this was necessary in order that the bridges might be completed within the time specified in the contracts. Virtually all workers now employed on government projects are limited to 30 hours.

Towels were braided together in a wet, hard mass and placed in the Maytag tub, from which they emerged entirely separated and spotlessly clean. A bath towel was stepped on and then put in the washer in cold water without soap of any kind. In

two minutes it was removed clean as a new towel.

Maytag's one-piece cast aluminum tub has extension legs, an instant tension release, steel bevel gears and single operating control. A special machine with windows on all sides was used for Saturday's demonstration.

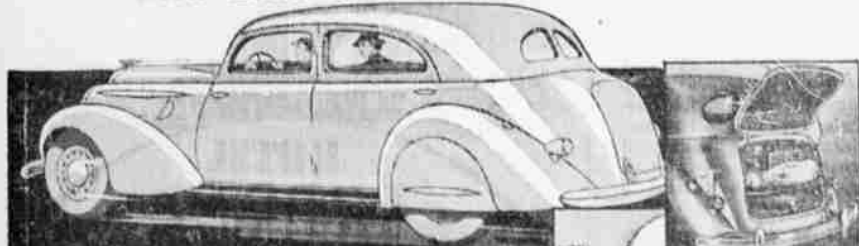
