SALEM, Aug. 30.—(AP)—Mark H. Skinner, Portland banker, was named by the state banking board here last night as state superintendent of banks to succeed A. A. Schramm whose term will expire September 1.

The announcement was made following the return of the banking board members from a trip by air to Bendition, Governor Martin, State Treasurer Holman and Secretary of State Snell comprise the membership of the board.

The new superintendent is a Democrat and a native of Michigan. He has spent 27 years of his life in the banking business. When reached last night he announced he would accept the position.

Skinner came to Portland in 1921 from St. Paul, Minn., where he was a vice-president of the First National bank. He served as vice-president of the Northwestern National bank of Portland until 1929. For the past three months he has been connected with the federal housing administration in Portland.

Skinner's appointment was made with the unanimous approval of the board, after it had been unable to agree on a selection at its meeting two days ago. Meanwhile scores of telegrams had been received from bankers throughout the state, most of them urging Schramm's retention.

Schramm has served eight years as head of the banking department. He came to Salem from a banking position in Corvallis. He was appointed by the late Governor Patterson.

## FLORIDA FATHER HELD IN FIERY DEATH OF GIRLS

MIAMI, Fla., Aug. 30.—(AP)—Two of his three daughters dead as a result of an early morning fire at his Northwest Miami residence, H. G. Denmark, 36, bakery salesman, was detained for the second time today for questioning.

## NEW MEXICO TOWN RAKED BY DELUGE; MANY HOMES LOST

LAS CRUCES, N. M., Aug. 30.—(AP)—Weather that a transcontinental flier today described as "up and down" was reflected on the ground in a damaging flood here early today.

No lives were lost but a newspaper estimate of the property damage was \$200,000 after saturated farm lands above the city poured their overflow over the urban area.

Meantime a fifth body had been recovered from the bus disaster yesterday near Wilcox, Ariz., where a westbound carrier with 28 passengers was caught by a surging cloudburst torrent as it roared through an underpass.

Holly, Colo., with aid from relief organizations continued rehabilitation work after Wednesday's inundation. Four feet of water that poured into this city after heavy rains last night crumbled many adobe houses. Fifty homes were known to have collapsed and many other families were forced to vacate their homes until the waters receded. The rain ceased during the forenoon.

## VACCINATION FOR SMALLPOX URGED

City Physician L. D. Inskip announced today that at the present time there are two cases of smallpox in Medford, both rather severe. Due to the fact that prior to quarantine both the cases were rather extensively in contact with the public, Dr. Inskip advised citizens of Medford to become vaccinated for the disease.

Those who have not been vaccinated for five years should take the precaution again, Dr. Inskip said, and vaccination should particularly be given children who have never had the treatment.
