CLARK, BENTLEY FINALISTS

PAIR WIN THROUGH BITTER CONTESTS IN SEMI-FINALS

Mrs. Thompson, Mrs. Wood Finalists in Women's Play Southern Oregon Championship—Fine Golf Seen

They halved the 13th, and thereafter both players put every iota of their concentration into their work, each stroke counting dearly.

Clark got off a long true drive on No. 14, and although Harding's second shot looked like a cinch par, Clark placed the ball 10 inches from the pin and won the hole with a birdie three to go one up. Both took good tee shots on the 15th, but Clark's second shot edged the cup for conceder par. Harding, to whom close competition in important tournaments is an old story, came through with a 20-foot sloping sidehill putt for a birdie three to square the match.

Clark Goes Up. They followed each other onto the green on No. 16, with steady, careful strokes, but Leland sunk a six-foot putt for a birdie to go one up again.

Both tee shots found the fairway on No. 17, with Harding away. His second shot hit the green but skidded too far, putting a bunker between him and the pin. Clark's second shot was safe on the green and 15 feet short. The veteran Texan pitched over the bunker to within 10 feet of the cup, but missed the sloping putt, and Clark two-putted for a safe par to win the match. Clark finished one over par, needing a par on No. 18 for a 33 for the second nine.

Quarter finals of the championship flight Sunday morning saw elimination of several golfers from out of town who put in strong bids early in the tournament, but could not stand up against the pick of the local field.

Leland Clark eliminated Dr. B. G. Barkwell of Ashland, 3 and 2, by taking the first three holes and halving all the rest through the 10th. Leonard Harding defeated Cecil Stevens of Portland, who has entered the tourney twice, in a close match that ended two up for the local golfer. Harding was one up at the turn and maintained that lead during most of the contest.

Eddie Simmons, 7 and 6, defeated Bob Gary of Eugene, a favorite of the gallery, by shooting a brilliant par 36 on the first nine to have near six down at the turn. Near staged a short-lived rally, but could not chop down Eddie's big margin.

H. B. Bentley defeated Eddie Hailaris of Portland, 5 and 7, another of the Portlanders under a six-up margin for the first nine and taking the 10th and 11th holes with straight par golf.
