PROVOLT GIRL HURT WHEN CARS COLLIDE, YOUTH SHOT IN FOOT

PROVOLT, Sept. 4.—(Sp.)—Labor day week-end brought its toll of accidents to this little community. Saturday night, what might have been a death-dealing accident occurred in front of the Elery Stone place when two cars locked wheels, turning one over and completely demolishing the other. Occupants of one car, Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Vineyard and two children, escaped with minor bruises and cuts but Miss Edna Moomaw, who was riding with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Seth Moomaw, in the other car suffered a broken nose and a bad gash down her face.

The accident happened on the stretch of road which is the object of much discussion at the present time. The road from Provolt to the end of the new pavement south of Murphy being in a deplorable condition, full of ruts, narrow and with sharp curves. A group of farmers with representatives of Josephine county are in Portland this week, presenting a petition for the re-surfacing of this stretch of road.

Another accident occurred Sunday evening when Forest Drake, 23, accidentally shot himself in the foot while hunting. He was rushed to the hospital in Grants Pass where he remained over the holiday. Drake, son of Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Drake, was hunting along the Applegate river, carrying a 22 automatic with the safety off. He stumbled in some brush, causing the gun to go off.
