POULTRY PRICES UP IN PORTLAND

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 10.—(AP)—Slight rise in poultry prices paid producers was announced today, with 18 cents a pound quoted for spring colored over 3 1/2 pounds in the live poultry division. Leghorn broilers under two pounds and springs above two pounds were quoted at 17 cents. Colored hens were quoted at 16 cents. Stags are 10 cents and roosters 8 cents.

Butter receipts have been light with active trading clearing the stocks immediately. Fresh supplies of all grades were unequal today to the excellent demand both locally and for shipping. Cheese market was steady, with prices unchanged. Egg market was firm, in sympathy with price advances in eastern markets.
