

TOWNSEND CLUBS IN TURMOIL OVER FINANCE SYSTEM

20,000 Threaten Revolt Unless Accounting Made for Thousands of Dollars Received From Aged Folk

SANTA CRUZ, Cal., Sept. 12.—(AP)—A revolt of 20,000 Townsend club members from the state and national old age pension organization was threatened today as an accounting was demanded for thousands of dollars contributed by 89 clubs in the Santa Cruz district.

The petition further demanded establishment of a policy of more open financial dealings by executives of the organization.

Reports of serious schisms in Townsend ranks over financial policies have dogged Dr. R. E. Townsend, elderly Long Beach, Cal., physician and founder of the movement, for months.

Claim Funds in Order

Clubs of the Santa Cruz area form the third largest Townsend district in the United States. The petitions demanded an accounting of funds were drafted today and placed in the hands of club officers in some dozen cities of the eighth congressional district.

Sam J. Daley, pioneer Santa Cruz district manager of the Townsend pension plan, claimed that state leaders have failed to account for thousands of dollars contributed in Santa Cruz county and neighboring counties.

"I expect as soon as this becomes known to be removed from the position of manager for this district," Daley said. "Pressure from members of clubs for an accurate accounting of money collected from individuals and forwarded to state officers in San Francisco to be sent to Washington, has become insistent."

Lossing Faith

"The situation is creating a great loss of faith in sincerity of the leaders of the 'Townsend movement,'" Daley declared.

"Dictatorship on the part of state

officers is being permitted. The 20,000 members in the eighth congressional district are voting a demand for democratic membership. Dictatorship is growing and is slowing down the Townsend movement."

MEIER FRANK WINDOW BROKEN WITH BOTTLE

The large window in the Meier & Frank department store was smashed with a beer bottle hurled from the street. The store's truck drivers recently went out on strike, demanding union recognition.

CANCER VICTIM'S SPLEEN PROVIDES LATEST DEFENSE

Medical Science Develops New Battle Plan Against Dread Disease—Artificial Cell Growth Is Basis

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Sept. 12.—(UP)—Medical science's long war on cancer was revealed last night to have developed a new battle plan, by which the human body's own disease fighting cells are aided in choking out a malignant tumor.

The new treatment involves the artificial multiplication of cells known as macrophages, taken from the patient's spleen and grown in a culture, and injecting them back in added and effective numbers to strangle the cancer.

Results of four years of experimentation with the new treatment were outlined at the American congress of physical therapy today by Dr. Gustav Kolischer, senior urologist at Michael Reese hospital in Chicago.

Not a Cure.

Kolischer warned his colleagues that the plan was advanced at this time not as a cure but as a theory of treatment that has recorded unusual achievements.

The greatly magnified powers of the macrophages after they have been grown in a culture enable them to wall off the diseased spot in the patient. They dam up supplies of nourishment which the cancer must have to continue to grow.

Then the surgeon's knife may remove the cancer tissue. Experiments to date have indicated that the macrophages also prevent the outbreak of a new cancer in a patient after one tumor has been removed. Dr. Kolischer said.

Aids in Operating.

"In some cases cancer disappears under cell injections," he added. "Others that have been impossible to operate have been made ready for operation by injections of the cell fluid so that they could be readily removed without exterior mutilation."

"It seems also that by these injections a zone of protection was produced preventing local recurrence of the cancer either disappeared entirely under the injection treatment or were considerably reduced in size and freely movable so they could be shelled out without removing the breast."

Dr. Kolischer pointed out that since the oldest case under treatment was now only in its fourth year, it was too soon to declare whether the treatment can bring results as sweeping and definite as it is believed it will.
