

RETAIL BUTTER PRICES FAIL TO ADVANCE WITH BOOST FOR PRODUCERS

Portland, Ore., Sept. 13.—(AP)—Retail prices in butter have shown little disposition to advance, even though the slight advance in the price to producers this week is being maintained. Prices of 32 cents a pound for A grade and 31 cents for B grade seem destined to hold. Local demand for all grades is excellent, and supplies are barely filling the needs. Wholesale egg market is approximately the same as last week, but withdrawals of storage products have been so heavy that prices have become somewhat mixed. Eggs graded from fresh stock were retailing at 35 cents a dozen, over-size, down to 23 and 24 cents a dozen for extra small. Undergrades are moving into shipping channels in liberal demand, as well as finding ready acceptance in local markets. Firmness is seen also in the cheese market, with retail advances on all kinds. Low scoring mild cheese is holding around 23 cents a pound, with sharp at 30 to 33 cents. Dressed and live poultry is steady, with no changes in prices quoted to retailers. Heavier receipts are expected today, and many houses have designated it as a special poultry day with premiums for most classes.

France's solidarity with the League of Nations covenant and a swing in

the French policy to the attitude that financial and economic sanctions are necessary in case Italy attacks Ethiopia were indicated in Paris and Geneva.

While the league met to prearrange peace, Italy continued troop movements toward East Africa and Emperor Haile Selassie of Ethiopia, as a precaution, ordered the mobilization of 75 per cent of all government employees.
