

# LAURA INGALLS SETS RECORD IN CONTINENT HOP

denly she zoomed out of the west over the brilliantly-lit field, and a large crowd cheered.

Miss Ingalls overshoot the field on her first attempt to land, gunned the low-wing black plane up again and finally dropped down at the east end of the airport.

"I'm sorry I kept you up so late," were her first words as she was helped out of the plane, her face flushed but showing fatigue.

"Everything went very smoothly all the way," she said. "The engine clicked perfectly."

"My radio went out west of Columbus, Ohio, so I started following the radio range beam."

"Over the Alleghenies I found I was following the wrong beam. I headed due east until I picked up the right one."

The official time was clocked as the monoplane roared over the field for the first time. Reporters waited until the wheels touched the ground before flashing the arrival.

Miss Ingalls said she was an hour late starting from Union Air terminal in Los Angeles because of adjustments to her landing gear.

"I'm delighted to have broken the record," she said, when officials gave her the time.

Veteran pilots laughed when Miss Ingalls marched onto Curtiss field in 1929 and announced her intention of becoming a flier. She looked so small and helpless. But ensuing years have changed the laughter to respect, for the former staidville dancer has become one of the nation's premier women aviators, the holder of many records.

During her early training, one of her instructors remarked that she would never become a flier. Miss Ingalls was somewhat discouraged, but a talk with Amelia Earhart, whose transcontinental record she smashed last night, restored her courage and she went to St. Louis to continue her flying career.

On April 10, 1930, she became the fifteen woman to qualify as a transport pilot. Her rise to fame began at that moment, for a few months later she established a new record for loops. The former record was 45 loops—Laura hung up a record of 344.

Disregarding critics who said stunt flying was too hazardous, Miss Ingalls then went on to execute 714 barrel rolls over Lambert field, St. Louis, to establish a record that bet-

tered the men's mark. In the summer of 1930, Miss Ingalls won third place in the Dixie air derby held at Chicago and by October of that year she was ready for her first transcontinental flight.

She made the flight in 25 hours through severe storms. Her record stood until Miss Earhart spanned the continent in 17 hours.

Miss Ingalls made elaborate plans for a solo flight across the Atlantic in 1931, but continued bad weather forced her to abandon the attempt, which she never took up again.

In 1934 the intrepid aviatrix made a 16,000-mile solo flight covering the treacherous Andes mountains in a circuit of South America.

# NEW CHANCELLOR DENOUNCES 'ISMS

CORVALLIS, Sept. 13.—(AP)—Speaking out strongly against communism and fascism, which he described as the twin enemies of democracy, Dr. Frederick M. Hunter, chancellor of Oregon's system of higher education, declared here Thursday that these and state socialism hold nothing for America.

Dr. Hunter, guest of honor at a banquet last night, made his first address to a Corvallis audience.

Another enemy to democracy, he declared, is "the growing spirit of dependence," as opposed to personal effort which has developed the American genius of accomplishment.

Civil liberties and the capitalistic system were pointed to by the new chancellor as the two best fruits of democracy. And both, he said, are being either misrepresented or threatened in what he described as these days of unsettling thinking and reaction to brute force.

# COAST SALMON CANNERS PLAN BIG AD CAMPAIGN

SEATTLE, Sept. 13.—(UP)—The Association of Pacific Fisheries and Northwest Salmon Canners today approved a \$200,000 advertising campaign designed to increase consumption of canned salmon throughout the nation.

Directors of the two organizations agreed to levy on members for the fund, in proportion to amount of salmon packed during the 1935 season. A committee will be named to handle the campaign.
