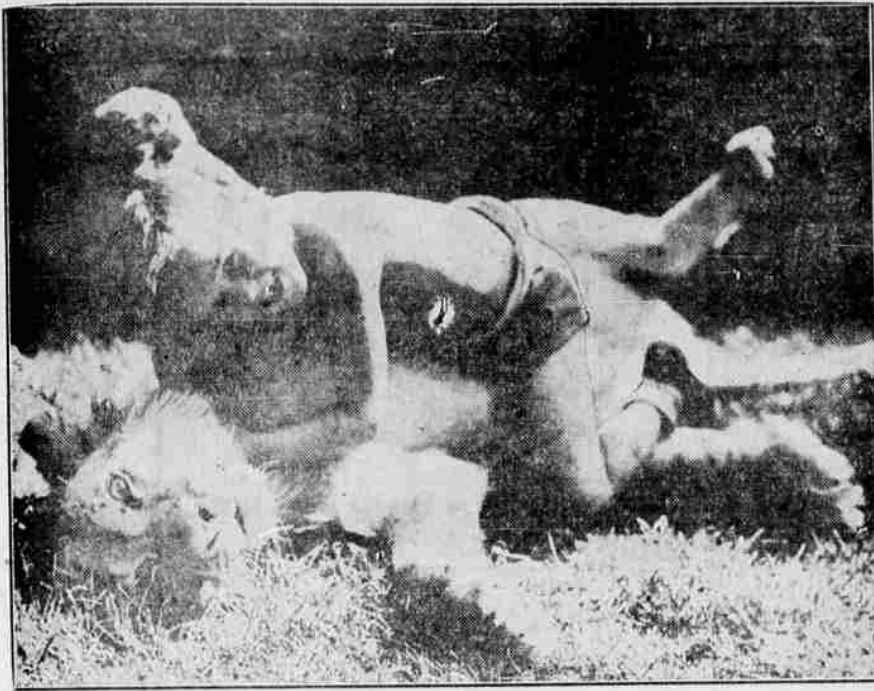


SALT LAKE CITY LAD PALS WITH LION CUB PET

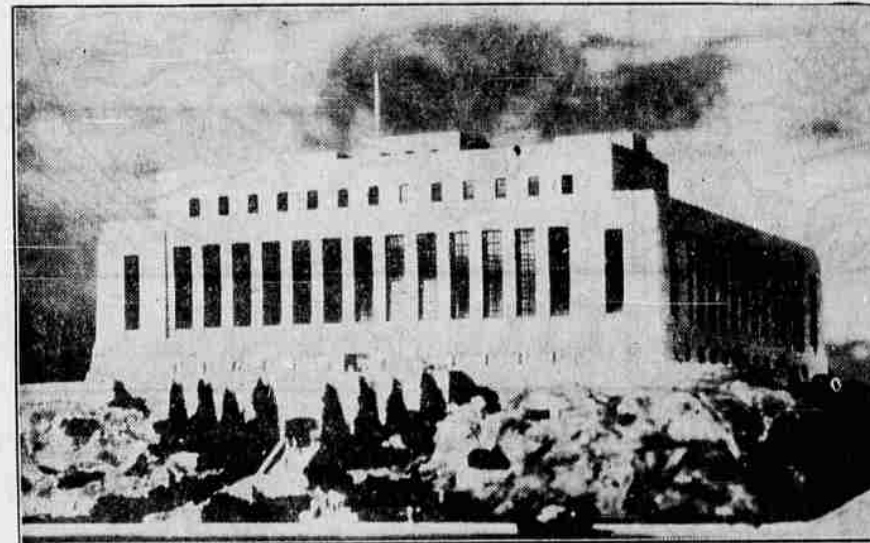
