### AMERICA REGRETS TO GERMANY FOR COURT'S COMMENT

WASHINGTON, Sept. 14.—(AP) The United States today expressed official regret that Magistrate Louis B. Brodsky of New York City had made "insulting" remarks concerning the Nazi flag, but disclaimed responsibility for his words as not voicing any official attitude of the government.

Secretary Hull extended this government's regret orally to Dr. Rudolf Lettner, charge d'affaires of the German embassy.

"Although in this country," Hull said, "the right of freedom of speech is well recognized as our fundamental law, it is to be regretted that an official having no responsibility for maintaining relations between the United States and other countries, should, regardless of what he may personally think of the laws and policies of other governments, thus indulge in expressions offensive to another government with which we have official relations."

Criticizing statements made by Magistrate Brodsky in which he referred to the swastika banner as a "pirate flag" in freeing five alleged communists charged with tearing the flag from the liner Bremen on July 26, Hull said:

"The department is constrained to feel that the magistrate, in restating contentions of the defendants in the case and in commenting upon the incident, unfortunately so worded his opinion as to give the reasonable and definite impression that he was going out of his way adversely to criticize the German government, which criticism was not a relevant or legitimate part of his judicial decision."

### WATER FOR MINES POWER, APPROVED

SALJEM, Ore., Sept. 14.—(AP)—Two large permits for water to be used in mining operations and for power purposes in Josephine and Baker counties were filed with the state engineer, C. E. Stricklin, engineer, announced today.

A. R. Carter of Portland requested 125 second feet of water from Mill, Birch, Quartz, Blanchard, Ricks creeks and the south fork of Gulch creek and north fork of Galice creek in Josephine county.

The Pine Creek Mining company and the Aurous Mining company of Portland requested 100 second feet of water from Pine creek, tributary of Snake river, for both mining and power purposes in Baker county.

Akerill & Taylor of Grants Pass asked permit to appropriate eight second feet of water from Quartz creek, tributary of Rogue river, for mining purposes in Josephine county.

### RUM SALE PROFIT NEARLY A MILLION

SALJEM, Ore., Sept. 14.—(AP)—Sale of hard liquor in Oregon since late February, 1934, has brought in a profit to the state of nearly one million dollars from that source alone, the secretary of state reported today in submitting a report of the conditions up to date.

With license fees and the revenue tax net receipts to the state totaled \$1,606,350. License receipts totaled \$212,149; tax revenue, \$430,934, and store operation, \$963,267. Administrative expense totaled \$13,547.

The liquor division has paid into state relief a sum of \$3,256,850 including issuance of certificates of indebtedness, or which \$950,000 of the certificates are still outstanding, the report shows.

### WALNUT GROWERS OF STATE TO QUIT AAA MARKET CODE

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 14.—(AP)—Contending that "the walnut industry of Oregon is strong enough to stand on its own legs," United States Senator McNary today joined Oregon walnut growers in their battle for home autonomy in walnut marketing.

Referring to a meeting of the agricultural adjustment administration to be held in Portland next Friday, Senator McNary advised the Associated Walnut Growers of Oregon of his belief that the industry in this state "can thrive better under a marketing agreement of its own making."
