# BOYCOTT AGAINST ITALY TALKED

## LEAGUE SOURCES REVEAL PLAN FOR ECONOMIC ACTION

Selassie Contemplating Nation-Wide Mobilization—British Naval Power Shows Up At Gibraltar.

ROME, Sept. 16.—(AP)—Premier Mussolini tonight reorganized Italy's fleet, dividing it into East and West superior commands, in answer to the British fleet concentration in the Mediterranean sea.

Friends of Emperor Haile Selassie said tonight at Addis Ababa that he may be obliged soon to proclaim nationwide mobilization unless the league of nations finds some way of saving the situation.

As though in confirmation of this report, a number of fighting craft, without announcement, suddenly showed up at Gibraltar.

By admiralty orders, apparently, the boom which is used for defense was swung out across the southern entrance to Admiralty harbor, just as was done last week at Malta.

French authorities said in Paris they hoped to get Premier Mussolini of Italy to sign another pact guaranteeing Austria's independence before hostilities break out with Ethiopia.

## SPECIAL SESSION CALL WAITS WORD ON FUND GRANT

SALEM, Sept. 16.—(AP)—The special session of the state legislature will be called immediately upon receipt of word from Washington on what action is taken on the state's application for a grant and loan of \$750,000 for the purchase of the Willamette university campus as additional ground for the new capitol.

The governor had before him a large drawing of the proposed capitol as it would appear on Candalaria Heights, the hill site favored by the executive. He said he had not given up the proposal and hoped the people of Oregon would "build for the future and not place the new structure on the small two and half acre tract where it formerly stood."

## JEWIS LOSE LAST CIVIL RIGHTS IN HITLERS DOMAIN

Cannot Become Citizens Or Marry Aryans—Swastika Designated As Flag Of Land—Rules Tightened.

NURNBERG, Germany, Sept. 16.—(AP)—The Reichstag of Adolf Hitler today relegated Jews in the Germany of the future to their position during the middle ages.

Legislation embodying these points was passed last night amid scenes of unexampled patriotic fervor and approval for the course Hitler has chosen to pursue strictly along the lines laid down in the original Nazi program.

## WILLIAM HANLEY, PIONEER FIGURE HEEDS SUMMONS

Eastern Oregon Cattle King Born In Jacksonville In 1861—Attended Round-up Saturday At Pendleton

PENDLETON, Ore., Sept. 15.—(AP)—Funeral services for William (Bill) Hanley, widely-known pioneer Oregon cattleman who died during the early morning hours here Sunday at the home of Dr. W. D. McNary, will be held at Burns at 2 o'clock Wednesday afternoon.

Excitement Too Much.  
Despite the fact that he had been confined to a sick-bed during most of the past two years, "Uncle Bill" as he was affectionately known by thousands, insisted upon attending "Hanley day" at the round-up. The excitement and strain proved too much for him, however, and he was forced to retire to Dr. McNary's home before the round-up events were concluded.

A telegram was received here yesterday by G. W.
