Six months jail sentences and fines of \$500 each were dealt today in circuit court to five men arrested here when state police closed a so-called "cocktail college."

MOODY EXPECTED TO HANDLE BANKS PARDON BRIBERY

SALEM, Ore., Sept. 21.—(AP) Ralph R. Moody, deputy attorney general, was named to conduct the grand jury investigations into gambling charges in Marion county and the city of Salem, Attorney General I. H. Van Winkle announced today.

Moody was named after District Attorney William Trindle requested a special prosecutor to take over the investigations. Gambling conditions were brought to the attention of authorities by a series of articles in the Salem Capital Journal and the matter was taken before the grand jury.

Sessions of the latter group will be resumed Monday when more depositions will be taken.

Moody, who represented the state in the recent hearing before the governor at which time charges of bribery were made against Dan Kellaher resulting in information being filed against the former parole officer for willingness to accept a bribe for the release of L. A. Banks, serving a life term for murder, was expected to be continued as special prosecutor in the Kellaher case.

The Marion county grand jury, following the gambling case, was expected to investigate the Kellaher charges. The latter was accused by Moody of signing a contract with Banks whereby the then parole officer would receive \$50,000 and other considerations should Banks be released from the state penitentiary. Kellaher was being held on bond.

NO DEARTH GOOD MEN AS SPEAKER SPECIAL SESSION

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 21.—(AP)—The race for speakership of the special session of the legislature had assumed definite lines today with Howard LaTourrette, Multnomah Democrat, the latest to declare his candidacy.

"I now have the support of a large number of the qualified members of the house," LaTourrette said in announcing his candidacy late yesterday.

"I feel that I am qualified to expedite the business to come before the special session fairly and impartially and in a harmonious manner and without rancor or discord, and for the best interests of the taxpayers."

William L. Graham, another Multnomah Democrat, announced his candidacy just 24 hours before the

announcement of Representative LaTourrette.

Others of the party who have been mentioned in the speakership race include N. Ray Alber and Victor J. Nelson, Multnomah, and Moore Hamilton, Jackson.

The principal Republican candidate was Earl Hill of Lane county.

KLAMATH WARS ON GAMING, FORGERS

KLAMATH FALLS, Sept. 21.—(AP)—Regulation of gaming devices involving the element of skill was advised by the Klamath County grand jury when it made its report.

The report was directed particularly at these practices outside the city limits of Klamath Falls. The city has a licensing ordinance regulating the game.

The jury also forwarded a communication to Governor Martin citing the flood of worthless checks in this county. The jury complained that too many offenders escaped prosecution because of executive failure to press for extradition.

Bonneville Power On Sale In 18 Months

PORTLAND, Sept. 21.—(AP)—Power from the Bonneville Columbia river project will be available within 18 months, Major R. F. Bessey, regional planning consultant, has advised members of the state planning board.

Plans for administration of the disposition of Columbia basin power should be laid as soon as possible, Major Bessey said.
