

REELECTION OF F. R. VITAL TO RECOVERY IS PIERCE WARNING

PORTLAND, Sept. 27.—(AP)—Representative Walter M. Pierce of the second congressional district declared today that re-election of President Roosevelt is vital to the continued progress of the nation toward economic, industrial and social recovery.

Representative Pierce, who outlined his views in an interview, was here as main speaker at the Willamette Democratic society, and as one of the guest speakers at the dinner tonight in honor of Judge Bert E. Haney in his new appointment.

It would be a national calamity, Congressman Pierce contended, to return the government to the group of "reactionaries" in control of those who control the opposition to President Roosevelt's re-election.

There yet remain close to 10,000,000 unemployed in the country, and the President's program for putting them back to work must be carried on to completion if normalcy is reached, he said.

COAL CONTROL TO STAY, F. D. SAYS

WASHINGTON, Sept. 27.—(AP)—Members of the new bituminous coal commission were assured today by President Roosevelt that federal regulation of the soft coal industry was here to stay.

While members of the commission, just sworn in, were visiting the White House, negotiators still attempted to settle the soft coal strike, now in its fourth day.

Philip Murray, vice-president of the United Mine Workers, had predicted either a "make or break" in the negotiations. "That something was in the wind was indicated when the four-man committee seeking an agreement took a recess so the producers could hold a caucus."

PORTLAND CATHOLIC LEADER TRANSFERRED

PORTLAND, Sept. 27.—(AP)—The Rev. Ambrose M. Mayer, founder of the famous Catholic sanctuary of Our Sorrowful Mother here, left last night

for Vancouver, B. C., to become rector of The Lady of Sorrows church in that city.

Father Mayer will be succeeded here by the Rev. Ambrose M. Griffin of Chicago.

Cod Liver Oil Is Course In School

COUER D'ALENE, Idaho, Sept. 27.—(AP)—A novel WPA school on cod liver oil base opened its second day here with 13 "students" enrolled.

It is a nursery school for undernourished children, 2 to 4 years old. The "course of study" includes stories and music in generous doses, cod liver oil, tomato juice and at least a pint of milk a day.
