BOY TAUGHT FLAG EMBLEM OF DEVIL

LYNN, Mass., Oct. 2 - (AP) - Carlton Nichols, Sr., who traces his ancestry to the Nipmuc Indians of Maine, and Edward H. James, of Puritan descent, must answer in court, Oct. 9, two charges arising from their refusal and the refusal of Nichols' small son, to salute the American flag. The men, who went to a Lynn school Monday to explain the religious grounds upon which eight year old Carlton Nichols, Jr., refused to salute the flag, were arrested after they had declined to join in the class flag saluting ceremony and refused to leave the school. The boy, whose family belongs to a religious sect known as Jehovah's Witnesses, objected to saluting the flag as an "emblem of the devil." He quoted biblical passages to show that all worldly domains are a part of the dominion of the devil. Nichols and James face charges of disturbing a school in session and of trespassing in a public building after being ordered to leave.

PLAN TO DEPORT 'WOMAN IN RED'

WASHINGTON, Oct. 2 - (AP) - Immigration officials said today the labor department has no power to cancel an order for the deportation of Anna Sage, who brought about the fall of Benoit John Dillinger. Melvin Purvis, former chief of the Chicago section of the federal bureau of investigation, said in Chicago he had promised to
