First Inning
Tigers—White up: White fanned, swinging, but Hartnett dropped the ball, and then hit to throw to first for the putout. Gehring up: Cochran batted through the box and was safe as the ball went through Herman for an error. Gehring up: Gehring grounded out, Hack to Cavarretta, and Cochran ran to second for the putout. Goslin up: Goslin popped to Jurgens, who backed up on the grass to make the catch.
No runs, no hits, one error, one left.
Cubs—Galan up: Galan lashed a single to right. Herman up: Herman fanned, swinging at a curve. Lindstrom up: Lindstrom scratched a hit along the third base line on the hit and run play, sending Galan to second. Hartnett up: Hartnett grounded to Rogell, and the Tigers pulled a double play, Rogell to Gehring to Owen.
No runs, on hit, no errors, one left.
Second Inning
Tigers—Fox up: Fox fouled to Hartnett on the first pitch. Rogell up: Rogell beat out a slow roller down the first base line and raced to second as the Cubs generally mismanaged the ball. It was a single for Rogell and an error for Cavarretta, who let the ball get away from him. Owen up: Owen rolled out, Jurgens to Cavarretta, Rogell advancing to third. Clifton up: Clifton grounded out Clifton to Cavarretta.

No runs, one hit, one error, one left.
Cubs—Demaree up: Demaree smashed a home run into the right field bleachers. The ball barely cleared the six-foot fence in front of the stands. Cavarretta up: Cavarretta lined to White. Hack up: Hack pushed a single over Clifton's head. Goslin made a diving stop of the ball and followed with a good throw to second base to keep Hack from stretching the hit. Jurgens up: Hack stole second. Jurgens lashed the ball down the third base line and was safe when Clifton failed to handle it. Hack reached third and Clifton was charged with an error. Lee up: Lee rolled to Gehring and was tossed out at first while Hack scored and Jurgens ran to second. Galan up: Galan fled to Goslin.
Two runs, two hits, one error, one left.

Third Inning
Tigers—Auker up: Auker lifted a high foul that Hartnett caught close to the boxes near the Tiger dugout. It was a brilliant play by the Cub backstop. White up: White rolled out, Herman to Cavarretta. Cochran up: Cochran walked, the fourth ball being wide. Gehring up: Gehring singled sharply past Cavarretta. Cochran stopping at second. Goslin up: Goslin lined to Galan who made a sensational leaping catch in deep left center just in front of the "third cage" bleacher and fully three hundred and sixty feet from the plate. It was one of the greatest defensive plays so far in the series.
No runs, one hit, no errors, two left.

Cubs—Herman up: Herman grounded out, Clifton to Owen. The new Tiger third baseman made a pretty pickup. Lindstrom up: Lindstrom grounded sharply to Clifton and was also thrown out at first. Hartnett up: Hartnett grounded out, Gehring to Owen.
No runs, not hits, no errors, none left.

Fourth Inning
Tigers—Fox up: Fox hoisted a high one to Jurgens. Rogell up: Rogell popped to Herman in short right field. Owen up: Owen grounded out, Jurgens to Cavarretta.
No runs, no hits, no errors, none left.

Cubs—Demaree up: Demaree fled to White. Cavarretta up: Cavarretta grounded out, Gehring to Owen. Hack up: Hack grounded out to Owen unassisted. The ball took a bad hop but Owen made a nice ployed-hand stop and beat the batter to the base.
No runs, no hits, no errors, none left.

Fifth Inning
Tigers—Clifton up: Clifton lined out to Lindstrom, who made a pretty running catch in left center. Auker up: Auker fanned, waving his bat at a fast curve. White up: White singled sharply, Jurgens to second. Cochran up: Cochran lined to Demaree, who made a circus catch near the foul line. The Cub right fielder dove for the ball and barely got his glove on it. He then turned a complete somersault. It was another striking piece of defensive work by the Cub outfielders and the crowd gave Demaree a terrific cheer.
No runs, one hit, no errors, one left.

Cubs—Jurgens up: Jurgens walked, the fourth ball being inside. Lee up: Lee sacrificed, Auker to Gehring, advancing Jurgens to second. Galan up: Galan singled to right scoring

Jurgens. Galan ran to second when Cochran mismanaged the throw from the outfield and failed to recover the ball in time to stop the Cub outfielder from advancing. Herman up: Herman's sharp drive caromed off Owen's glove for a base hit, sending Galan to third. Lindstrom up: Lindstrom rolled to Gehring and the Tigers pulled a double play, Gehring to Rogell to Owen. It was a close decision at first base and the Cubs put up a mild squawk.
One run, two hits, one error, one left. Cochran was charged with an error on the play that enabled Galan to take an extra base.

Sixth Inning
Tigers—Gehring up: Gehring popped to Hack who came all the way across the field to make the catch between the pitcher's box and first base. Goslin up: Goslin lashed a single to the infield to right. Fox up: Fox smashed a hit down the right field line for three bases, scoring Goslin. The ball caromed off the corner of the field boxes and was handled poorly by Demaree. Rogell up: Fox was trapped off third base on Hartnett's snap throw to Hack.
Four runs, four hits, no errors, none left.

Cubs—Schoolboy Rowe went to the box for the Tigers. Herman up: Lindstrom lifted a high fly that Goslin caught near the left field line. Hartnett up: Hartnett fled to White. Demaree up: Demaree fanned, swinging at a low curve.
No runs, no hits, no errors, none left.

Ninth Inning
Tigers—Clifton up: Clifton fanned. Rowe up: Rowe grounded out, Hack to Cavarretta. White up: White fanned, swinging.
No runs, no hits, no errors, none left.

Cubs—Cavarretta up: He filed deep to White in right center. Hack up: Hack lined a single past Rogell. Klein up: Klein punched a single between third and short, sending Hack to second. O'Dea up: O'Dea lined a hit to right scoring Hack and sending Klein to third. Galan up: Galan fled to White in deep center and Klein scored the tying run standing up. O'Dea remained at first. Herman up: Herman grounded out, Clifton to Owen.
Two runs, three hits, no errors, one left.

Tenth Inning
Tigers—Larry French, veteran southpaw, went to the box for Chicago as the game went into extra innings.
Klein went to right field, Demaree to center and Lindstrom to third base. Hack moved over to short, replacing Jurgens.
Cochran up: Cochran hoisted a high foul that Lindstrom caught just outside the third base line. Gehring lifted a high fly that Klein plucked along the foul line a few feet from the lower stands. Goslin up: Goslin smashed a hit to right center for two bases. Fox up: Fox popped to Cavarretta.
No runs, one hit, no errors, one left.

Cubs—Lindstrom up: Lindstrom smashed the first pitch to the screen in right center for two bases. Hartnett up: Hartnett batted beautifully along the first base line, sacrificing Lindstrom to third as he was thrown out, Cochran to Gehring. Demaree up: Demaree grounded out. Rogell to Owen, and Lindstrom was held at third. Cavarretta up: Cavarretta grounded out on the first pitch, Gehring to Owen.
No runs, one left, no errors, one left.

Eleventh Inning
Tigers—Rogell up: Rogell lined a single past Hack. Owen up: Owen batted to Lindstrom and Rogell was forced at second, Lindstrom to Hack. Owen reached first. Clifton up: Clifton's roller got away from Lindstrom as it took a bad hop. Lindstrom was charged with an error as Owen reached second and Clifton got to first. Rowe up: Rowe fanned, swinging hard. White up: White lined a single to center, scoring Owen and sending Clifton to third. White ran to second on the throw-in as the ball got away from Hartnett. Cochran

up: Cochran fouled high to Hartnett.
