## WEST'S GRAIN SURPLUS MAY GO CHINA, JAPAN

WASHINGTON, Oct. 4.—(AP)—Estimated demands of China and Japan for 35,000,000 bushels of wheat in 1935-36 were seen today as a possible answer to the grain surplus problem in the Pacific northwest.

Reports to the bureau of agricultural economics from representatives in the Orient place the expected demands for China at 20,000,000 bushels and those of Japan at 15,000,000 bushels.

Surplus of wheat in Oregon, Washington and Idaho this year was not as large as in 1932, when 41,000,000 bushels of the old crop were on hand July 1 as a new crop of 83,000,000 bushels was being harvested. The surplus brought the total supply at that time in the three states to nearly 125,000,000 bushels.

All of the 21 counties in west Tennessee and two took their names from American soldiers, patriots and statesmen.
