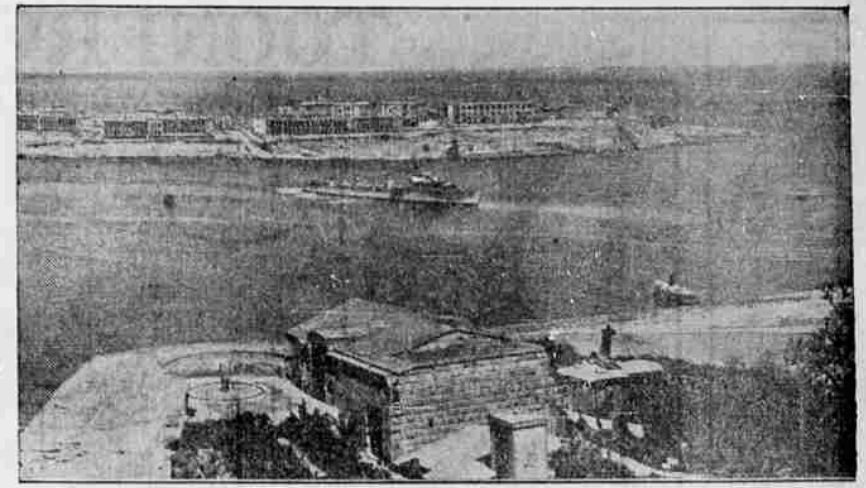

ESCAPING YACHT IN MID-OCEAN

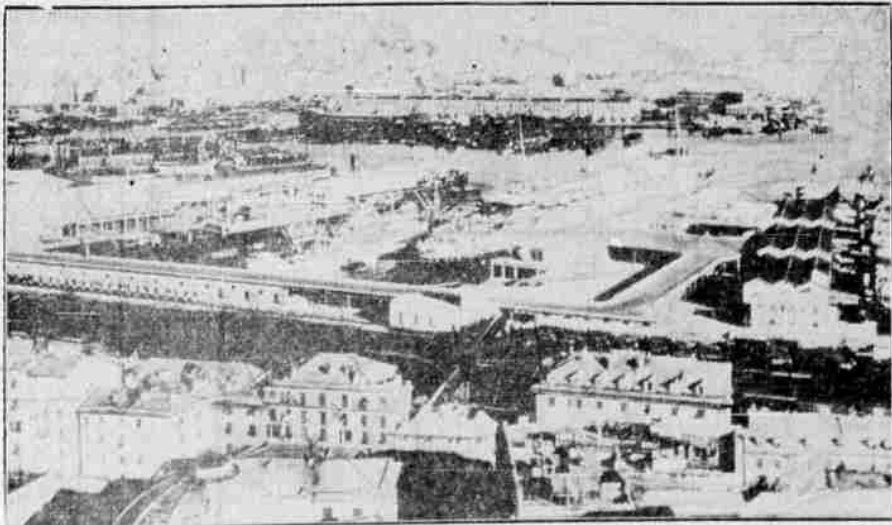

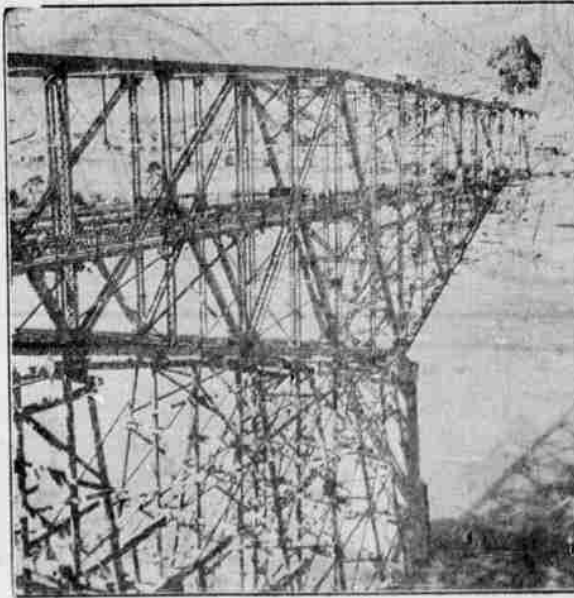
