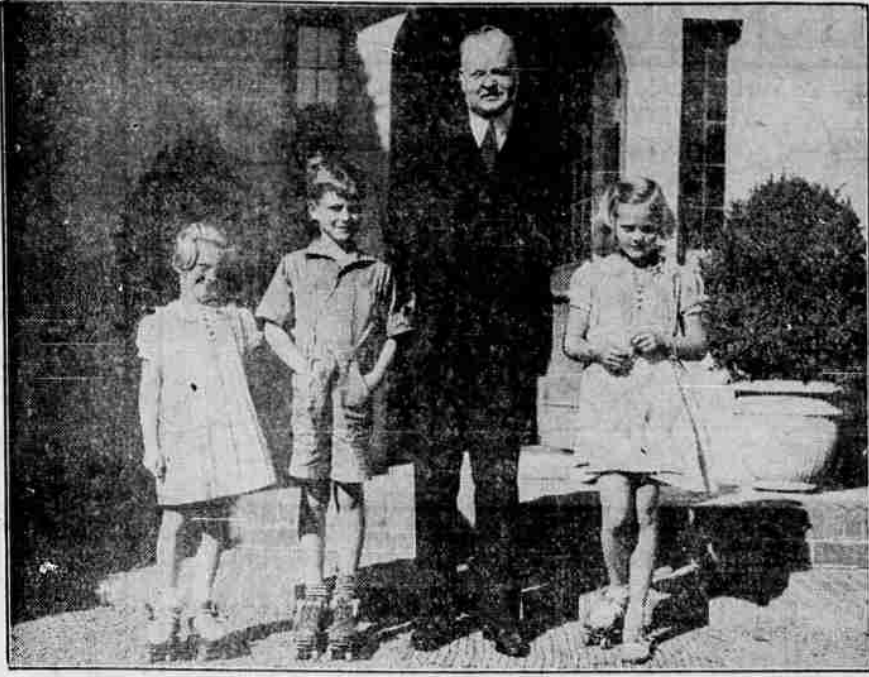
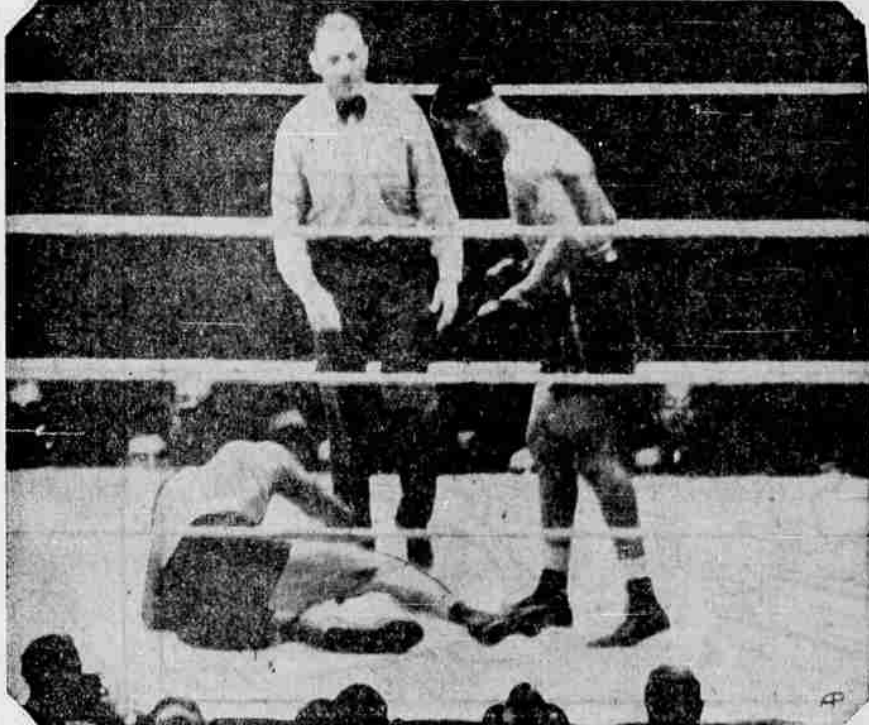


FORMER PRESIDENT AND HIS GRANDCHILDREN

ETHIOPIANS START TRENCHES IN CAPITAL



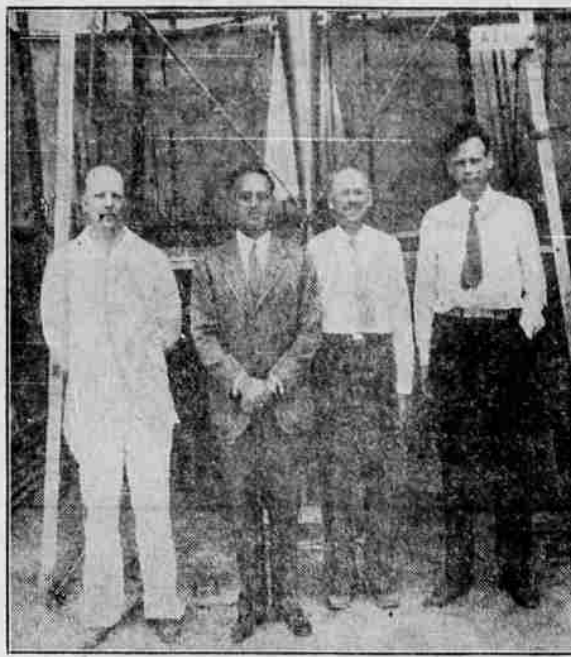
