

FILIPINOS GRANT AIRWAY FRANCHISE

MANILA, Oct. 16.—(AP)—The Philippine house on the eve of adjournment today approved the Pan-American Airways franchise, but reduced its length from 25 to 20 years. Senate concurrence is expected.

A clause was inserted in the measure providing for a maximum fine of \$10,000 for "substantial violation" of the franchise provisions.

In preparation for its projected airline between California and Canton, China, the always seaplane Clipper has made several flights from Alameda, Cal., to Honolulu, Wake Island, the Midway Islands, and Sunday reached Guam, so far its farthest point out.

MENACE SEEN IN ITALIAN FORCES CLOSE TO EGYPT

would restrict its imports from Italy to further the embargo.

League circles in Geneva gave the following as the basis of Laval's peace plan:

Ethiopia would give all of the northern Tigre province, now held by the Fascists, to Italy. In addition, it would have a mandate over the outlying regions of Haile Selassie's empire—thus allowing Italy to build a railroad from north to south on the eastern border of Ethiopia, connecting his provinces on the north and Somaliland on the south.

Effort fails But Laval's efforts were fruitless. The Italians—their East African armies driving south against Makale in northern Ethiopia; and northward strategically important Harar in the southeastern sector—were given the plan the cold shoulder.

A government spokesman in Rome said Italy was well aware of Laval's efforts. He added, however, that Rome was not a party to any negotiations.

"Even a European war," the spokesman said, "would not turn the Fascist nation from its African course."

Likewise gloomy was the outlook in Paris. Laval's own capital.

In official government circles, the following view was given:

"Laval's view is that the Italian campaign must be halted immediately if conciliation with Britain is desired, since Britain thus far has refused to talk terms until the Italian troops evacuate Ethiopia."

"As for the Vatican, it limited its suggestions to a hope of speedy conciliation, its efforts avoiding any territorial recommendations."

The mention of the Vatican's stand was accompanied by a denial that the Papal Nuncio in Paris had delivered a peace suggestion from Pope Pius to Laval.

The Italian drive—with tanks rumbling ahead and ground and air squadrons in advance aloft—opened under General Emilio de Bono, commander-in-chief of the Fascist forces in East Africa, received the complete submission of the civil and religious authorities of the Holy City of Aksum, seat of the Coptic Christian church in Ethiopia.

Italian troops marched peacefully into Aksum after dark. Previously, they had refrained from entering the holy city.
