

RAISE MORE HELL AND LESS WHEAT, MAY BE FARMERS WATCHWORD

TOPEKA, Kas., Oct. 18.—(AP)—Predictions that American farmers may "raise less wheat and more hell," and demand an amendment to the constitution if the AAA is declared unconstitutional, came today from a farm bureau head and an economics professor in a wheat-state college.

Edward A. O'Neal, president of the American Farm Bureau Federation, told a joint meeting of the Kansas Farm Bureau and extension workers of Kansas State college that "six million farmers will rise up almost like one man and demand an amendment to the constitution if the supreme court throws out the processing tax."

Prof. W. A. Irvin, widely-known head of the department of commerce at Washburn college here, warned that coming decision of the supreme court on the AAA and processing taxes are packed with "economic, political and social dynamite."

"Raise less wheat and more hell," may be the slogan of the farmers, he said, if the AAA is ruled unconstitutional.

PORTLAND EGGS HOLD UNCHANGED

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 18.—(AP)—There was no change in egg prices today.

Strength of the market for fresh eggs is more or less of reasonable character although the chief betterment at the moment appears from the willingness of the state department of agriculture to allow the placing of "fresh" signs over current offerings.

Trade in the butter market is much mixed here with many reports of improper grading, which is said to be more or less prevalent here and without action by the state department of agriculture.

Steadiness was generally suggested in the market for live chickens locally which appears to be about the same as ruling along the coast generally. No change in prices.

Toward the weekend there was practically no change in the general trade for country killed meats. The only softness is in the heavier calves.

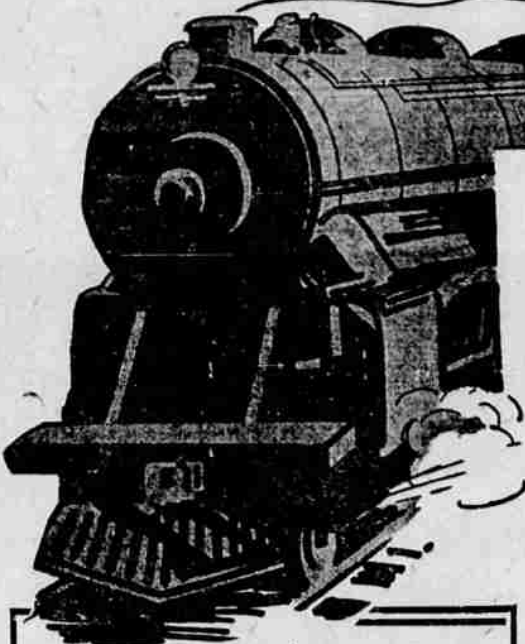

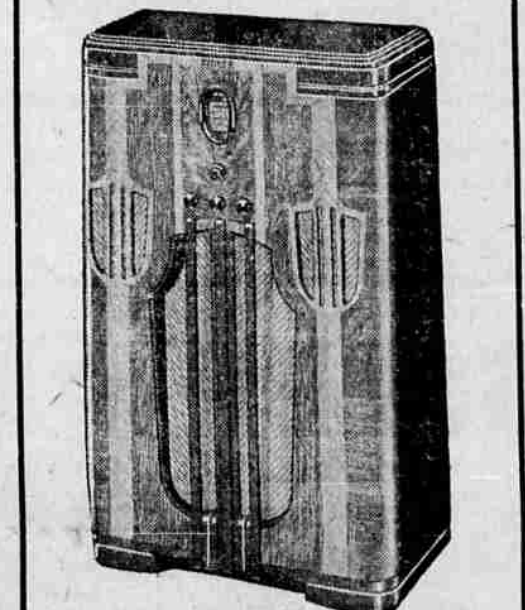

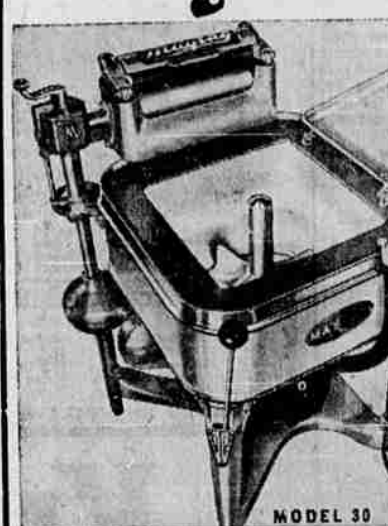
