



MARSHFIELD TEAM BOASTS EFFECTIVE PASSING OFFENSE

Big Invaders Due Tonight For Saturday's Brush With Tigers—Bowerman Will Start Regulars.

A big, powerful football aggregation from Marshfield will arrive in Medford tonight at 6:30 for their game at Van Scoyoc field tomorrow afternoon at 2:00 o'clock against the Medford Tigers. The Bonecrushers come armed with one of the best passing attacks they have had in years, and they have always given Medford teams a tough fight.

Coach Bowerman of Medford last night ran his charges through an intensive pass-defense drill in preparation for the expected onslaught, and will taper off tonight with a light drill on general work.

A new method of making the try-for-point after touchdowns will be attempted with Smith dropping the ball for the placement. The big kicking half has shown surprising aptitude for this one-time dangerous weapon, and Bowerman has had a new pair of shoes with a square kicking toe made for him.

Stan Kunsman, veteran end who last year played fiery ball but was inclined to be a bit uncontrolled, showed such cool headedness under fire at Roseburg last week that he has been appointed acting captain of the Tigers for the game. Kunsman is the spark-plug of the Medford line.

Enthusiasm at the high school was at fever pitch today for the first home game of the season. A pep rally is scheduled for this afternoon at the school, and a downtown serpentine will greet the incoming Marshfield players, then wind through the entire business section.

Although hit by backfield injuries in the last game, and again through the week, Bowerman intends starting the regulars against the Bonecrushers. His starting lineup as announced today will include: right end, Grow; right tackle, Blair; right guard, Dickinson; center, Wilson; left guard, Bakke; left tackle, Santo; left end, Kunzman (captain); quarterback, Ettlinger (Bob); right half, Smith; fullback, Sakrads; left half, Lewis.
