

### GRADE CROSSING, HIGHWAY GRADE FUNDS APPROVED

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18.—(AP)—Presidential approval of allocations totaling \$3,198,490 for grade crossing elimination and improvement of highway roads and streets in Oregon was announced today by works headquarters.

Of this amount \$1,573,669 will be used for highway, road and street improvements while \$1,624,791 was set aside for elimination of hazards at grade crossings.

Twenty seven projects, seventeen for highways, roads and street improvements and 10 for grade crossing elimination were included in the list. A balance of \$708,413 remains to the credit of Oregon for grade cross-

ing work, the original appropriation being \$2,334,204, while \$1,464,973 remains unallocated from the appropriation of \$3,038,642 for highways, roads and streets.

The crossing projects, all grade separations, included:

Wall creek crossing south of Ashland, Southern Pacific railroad, \$205,000.

The highway projects included:

Ashland-Clawson, route 3, grading, estimated cost \$125,000.

The grade crossing and grading projects come under the jurisdiction of the state highway commission, although workers may be obtained through the PWA office here, county officials explained.

The highway paving contract has already been awarded and work was to be in full swing by the first of the week. The grade crossing is on the Siskiyou mountain and it was expected contract for the work would be awarded soon.

### WITNESS UPHOLDS MOONEY'S ALIBI

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 18.—(AP)—Charles A. Griffin, 58, Seattle, Wash., advertising man, testified at Thomas J. Mooney's habeas corpus hearing today that former district attorney, Charles M. Fickert, suppressed his evidence that he had seen Mooney on top of the Elberta building at the time a bomb exploded a mile away, killing 10 persons.

The tall, white-haired, dignified former San Francisco court reporter, appearing for the first time in any of the numerous proceedings brought in Mooney's behalf, declared when he told prosecuting officials of being with Mooney at the time of the bomb explosion, Fickert cautioned him not to tell anybody and promised to get him a job.

In many respects, this testimony corroborated that given from the stand by Mooney and his wife, Rena.

### ALABAMA BLACKS BOYCOTT ITALIANS

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., Oct. 18.—(AP)—A widespread boycott by negroes of Italian-owned stores was reported by the sheriff's office here today, as a group of merchants called on Solicitor George Lewis Bailes to protest.

The boycott was said to have arisen out of sympathy of the negroes for the Ethiopians in their struggle against the Italian Fascist forces.

"Although our fathers and mothers came from Italy, we're Americans," said one merchant, pointing to his American Legion button. "We'd be interested in this war only if America enters it."

Sheriff Fred McEuff is conducting an investigation of reports that communists are agitating the boycott and organizing the negroes.

Solicitor Bailes pointed out that Alabama has an anti-boycott statute providing for fines from \$100 to \$1000 and hard labor sentences of not more than six months.
