

### GROWERS TO SEE CONTROL OF PEAR BLIGHT ON FRIDAY

A meeting of pear growers of the Rogue valley will be held at the Southern Oregon experimental station near Talent at 2:00 p. m. Friday, it was announced today.

The meeting was called by O. B. Corby, assistant county agent, to give growers a final opportunity to see the results obtained by the selection of blight resistant French root stocks. The work of selection has been carried on for the past 20 years by Prof. F. C. Reimer who has gathered pear stocks from several foreign countries and now has what is said to be the largest variety collection to be made in the world.

From this collection several resistant types were developed but as they were not considered satisfactory from a growth standpoint they were discarded as commercial possibilities for root stocks.

Feeling that the French root stock was the best for all-around purposes, Professor Reimer planted 10,000 commercial French seedlings which were inoculated with blight-producing bacteria. Each year many trees died and the remainder were again inoculated until finally only ten trees were left which were entirely resistant to blight infection, Mr. Corby explained.

Seedlings from these ten resistant French seedlings have been propagated along with commercial French seedlings. What is described as the "phenomenal" resistance to blight and the uniformity of growth of these selected trees as compared with the blighted condition of the commercial seedlings will be shown the growers at Friday's meeting.

All valley growers are urged to attend as it was said this will be the last opportunity to see the final results of blight resistance in selected French root stocks.

### NEGROES CONFESS MURDERING GIRL

COLUMBUS, Texas, Oct. 22.—(AP)—Sheriff Frank Hoegmeyer said today two negroes confessed to him that they criminally attacked and killed Miss Geraldine Kollman, 19, whose body was found in a creek Thursday. At first it was believed she had drowned.

Sheriff Hoegmeyer said the negroes, Bennie Mitchell, 19, and Ernest Collins, 18, made a full confession to the attack and slaying Sunday night. They were rushed to the Harris county jail at Houston after being charged with criminal attack and murder.

### MULTNOMAH PENSION BORROWING ILLEGAL

SALEM, Oct. 22.—(AP)—The 1935 legislative act providing for Multnomah county to borrow funds to carry out the old age pension law for the county, was declared unconstitutional in an opinion by Chief Justice J. U. Campbell of the Oregon supreme court today.

The case was entitled Multnomah county, respondent, vs. First National Bank of Portland, a corporation, and I. H. Van Winkle, attorney general.

The act was held to be in violation of article IV, section 26, of the Oregon constitution because of its defective title.

### EXPECT 6000 PERSONS AT TOWNSEND CONFAB

CHICAGO, Oct. 22.—(AP)—Organizers of the first national convention of Townsend old age pension clubs today said indications were 6000 persons, including 3000 delegates, would be present when formal sessions begin Thursday.

"This doubles our expectations," said Robert E. Clements, national secretary and co-founder with Dr. F. E. Townsend of the plan to pay \$200 per month to persons 60 years of age or older.

key, notified the league today they had put into effect the first sanction imposed against Mussolini's government, the embargo on shipment of arms to Italy.

With their action, 23 nations have imposed arms embargoes.

No Gas Used, Says Halle

In Addis Ababa, Emperor Haile Selassie told the Associated Press correspondent there was no truth to reports the Italian army had used either poison gas or dum-dum bullets.

In Washington, the state department indicated there was little immediate possibility the United States would follow the lead of Great Britain and invoke the 1907 Hague neutrality convention.

There were indications from Paris and Rome the efforts for peace were definitely shaping up. It was expected the Duce's terms for ending this conquest against Haile Selassie's empire would be transmitted to London, and then to the league, through Premier Pierre Laval, of France.

While Mussolini and Sir Eric Drummond, the British ambassador, have been trying to allay the tense feeling between Rome and London, one of the day's developments was likely to add to the strained relationship.

Bar British Paper

The Italians barred from circulation in Italy the London Daily Telegraph, a conservative newspaper, and regarded in political circles as the mouthpiece of Captain Anothony Eden, Britain's leader at Geneva.

While an unconfirmed Exchange Telegraph report said the Ethiopians suffered heavy losses in assaulting the Italian lines, official communications said all was quiet at the front.

Heavy rains in the southeast Ethiopia desert area delayed the northward drive toward Harar of the Roman legions under General Rudolfo Graziani.

### Six Inches Snow On McKenzie Pass

EUGENE, Oct. 22.—(AP)—Winter chill hovered over Lane county this morning with low temperatures reported from the high Cascades where six inches of snow covered the McKenzie pass area.

The pass was being kept open by the use of snow plows, no snow having been reported since the heavy fall late Sunday afternoon.

### Dalles Tomatoes Nipped by Frost

THE DALLES, Ore., Oct. 22.—(AP)—Tomato vines and other garden plans were nipped by frost last night as the temperature dropped to 33 degrees in valley districts and below freezing in the higher orchard areas.

Temperatures were not low enough to cause damage to apples or to injure unpicker grapes in local vineyards. Lettuce here was not damaged.

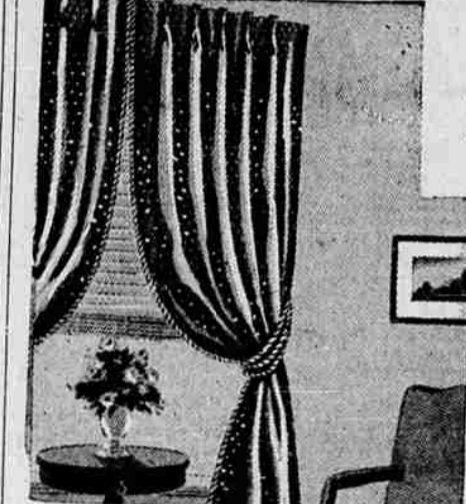
