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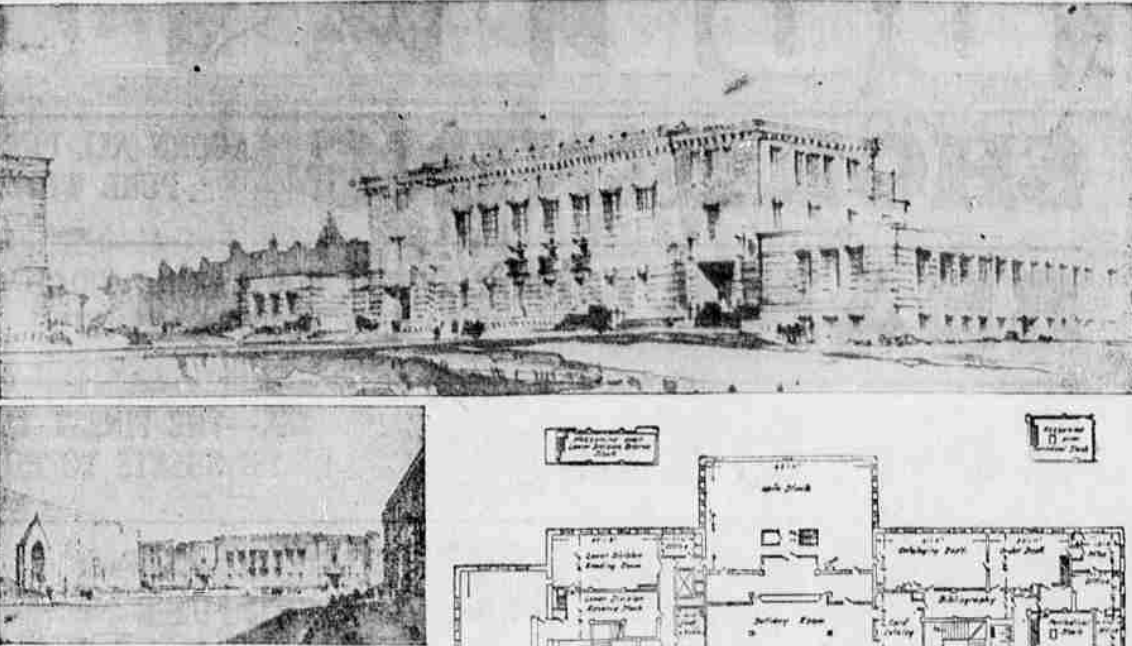
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ARTIST'S SKETCHES SHOW HOW NEW LIBRARY WILL LOOK!

RACE WITH WINTER IS WON BY CCC IN BUILDING ROADWAY

Five-Mile Route to Summit of Battle Mountain Finished As Snow Flies — Tower Also Completed

CAMP WINTER, Nov. 1.—(Sp.)—A whirl of snowdrifts first of the winter, heralded the completion Wednesday of Wimer's number one project, a road to the summit of Battle Mountain and a 40 foot modern observation tower on the peak.

SETS Tower Record M. M. Manning, ECW tower and bridge foreman, who completed the 14x148 observation house of the type authorized July 10, 1935, stated that the Battle Mountain tower was completed in 123 man days less time than his previous record.

Although the Battle Mountain road was completed first due to the pressing need for a trail over which the summer lookout could travel and a safe tower for his silent watchings, the Ditch creek-King mountain road was of first importance for fire protection.
