**COLD SNAP COSTLY IN UNION COUNTY**

LA GRANDE, Ore., Nov. 8. — (P) — The long cold snap in Union county ruined between 20,000 and 25,000 boxes of apples in the Elgin area and from 50,000 to 75,000 boxes in the

Timber district, a survey disclosed today. More than half the harvest was completed before the early cold spell descended. Potato growers were not sure yet of the extent of damage. In some places the freeze was shallow and the ground dry. Wheat growers likewise waited until the return of moderate weather to make estimates of fall wheat loss.

GRESHAM, Ore., Nov. 8. — (P) — A

crop loss of more than \$500,000 will result in Multnomah county from the cold wave, County Agent S. B. Hall estimated today. The cold killed practically the entire late cauliflower crop with a loss of about \$250,000, he said. Cabbage loss was about \$50,000. Practically all garden produce and dairy forage in this section was nipped.
