SPOKANE, Wash., Nov. 8.—(AP)—A gaping hole in the ice of Hangmen creek marked the death trap today of a farmer boy and a 7-year-old sister who tried heroically to save him.

The victims, Raymond McDonald, 12, and Wilma, drowned after breaking through the two-inch ice while sledding late yesterday.

No one saw the tragedy, but the girl's sled several yards away led officials to the belief the girl plunged into the chill waters in an effort to reach her brother.

IOWA FARMERS ENJOY BEST TIMES IN YEARS

AMES, Iowa, Nov. 8.—(AP)—Economic charts which record the month-by-month condition of the Iowa farmer reflected the brightest agricultural prospects today that Iowa has seen in five years.

The purchasing power of Iowa farm products has reached "parity," the goal of the farm administration, Iowa State college economists reported.

Iowa farm income, increased by \$80,000,000 in crop benefit payments, has climbed steadily.

FULL NAVY AIR FORCE IS VISIONED FOR 1940

WASHINGTON, Nov. 8.—(AP)—Rear Admiral Ernest J. King, chief of the bureau of aeronautics, said today there was a possibility that by 1940 the navy will have an air force adequate to complement a treaty strength navy.

Under present ship building plans, the navy will reach by 1942 the full sea fighting strength permitted by the Washington and London naval treaties.

"There is a possibility," King said, "that we will have in 1940 the 1,910 planes we originally intended to build by 1942."
