On the final vote three others changed over, which however would not have changed the result either way. They were T. W. Munyan, Democrat of Lebanon, and Harvey Wells and Robert Farrell, both Republicans, of Portland.

The house at noon had passed the unemployment insurance bill after defeating the minority report which would have taxed the employer as well. The bill, passed as a part of the federal social security program, was termed the "payroll tax." It would become effective in 1938.

The senate passed the minority report on a substitute bill for the Pearson measure, which was killed earlier in the week, allowing the board of control, at its discretion, to insure state property. The Pearson bill was sent back to committee recently, on a vote for reconsideration, and reached the floor today in the form of the substitute bill.

Sens. Walker and Lee, leading the fight for the minority report, argued that the restoration fund would remain as at present but that the board of control should be permitted to buy insurance on certain state properties.

Sens. Zimmerman and Burke were the only dissenting votes.

Governor Martin signed senate bill 48, introduced by Senator Hess, which provides for the remission of interest and penalty on the payment of delinquent taxes on personal and real property. It is anticipated that this bill will raise considerable additional funds.
