

# REARMING EUROPE PAUSES TO RECALL END OF WORLD WAR

eral elections front in Great Britain as the public massed solidly at Whitehall about the cenotaph for two minutes of silence in remembrance of the world war dead.

Italy devoted its ceremonies to commemoration of the 50th birthday anniversary of King Victor Emmanuel, with Premier Mussolini reviewing his armed legions.

For armistice day elsewhere—Italy having celebrated the anniversary of its own armistice with Austria a week ago—the Italians recalled that their share of the allies' triumph in 1918 brought what they considered a small share of the spoils.

### Italy Sees Destiny

They took that day as only one of reconsecration to the task of pursuing in Ethiopia what Italy regards as its legitimate destiny in the face of League of Nations sanctions.

In Paris, the nationalistic Croix de Feu veterans organization opened the celebration with a show of strength, thousands of its members parading in advance of the official military review and demonstrations by leftist opposition bodies.

The Italian consul was among the representatives of foreign powers who attended a service at the British memorial cemetery in Alexandria, Egypt.

## ROXY ANNE CCC MINES OWN COAL

The CCC men at Camp Prescott are not going to shiver in the morning after dragging themselves out of

a warm bed if they can help it and it looked today as though they could help it.

The company occupying Prescott Memorial park arrived here but a week ago from Vancouver barracks district in Washington where they had been living in tents in sub-zero weather and they had enough experience with the cold to avoid it in future whenever possible.

But unless there is a slow-burning fuel at hand one is likely to suffer the pangs of cold early in the morning almost every part of the country during winter. So the problem before the CCC men was to find a fuel that would burn slowly throughout the night, leaving the stoves warm and cozy at the zero hour when the early bludge sends the air with dismaying clarity and persistence.

The Camp Prescott men have found such a fuel. They have found coal after a careful exploration conducted under the supervision of their educational adviser, O. P. West, who comes from a family of eastern coal operators and knows the black substance when he sees it and how to wrest from the earth. The coal was found less than a mile from the camp site.

And now four CCC men who had experience in eastern coal mines are digging with pick and shovel under Mr. West's directions. Already the coal is being used and giving excellent results, said Mr. West.

"It is surface coal, of course," Mr. West explained. "It is a coarse grade of shale coal but it burns and we are now using it to supplement wood. We hope to get out enough to carry us through the winter. There is the possibility that we may strike a vein and if the prospects are good we may be able to get equipment to enlarge the scope of our mining operations."

Mr. West's father, the late Joseph A. West, was a large coal operator in Pennsylvania and his brother, F. R. West, is president of the Pittsburgh Coal company.

# ROOSEVELT FIRST TO NOTE INSIGHT OF WILL ROGERS

The Will Rogers Memorial fund

campaign began its second week today. The campaign will continue until Thanksgiving eve. During that period an opportunity is offered to the millions who were entertained by the philanthropic comedian to contribute to the memorials that are to be established in his commemoration.

There is no goal set in the fund campaign. The national committee in charge states that the number of contributors is of more importance than the amount of the contributions. Ex-President Theodore Roosevelt was among the first to realize the influence Will Rogers was to play in American life.

Albert D. Lasker, advertising genius recalls an episode in the life of Rogers, indicating his honesty of opinion which was so definitely recognized by the American public.

Mr. Lasker says: "The first time that I had the pleasure and privilege of meeting Will Rogers was in the last days of October, 1918—just 17 years ago. I was at that time assistant to Mr. Will H. Hays, chairman of the Republican national committee.

"Late one afternoon, ex-President Theodore Roosevelt phoned me to come to his office. Arriving there he took me aside and said: 'I have in one of my rooms a man to whom I wish to make you know. I met him but a few days ago. He and I are living at the same hotel. He is an actor who is performing in the Amsterdam theater. His turn consists of a monologue wherein he makes comments on current events. The man has such a keen insight into the American panorama and the American people that I feel, in the course of time, he is bound to be a great factor in the political life of the nation.'

are doing. I want you to meet him because his good-will can prove a great asset to our party."

"He then took me into the adjoining room, introduced me to Will Rogers and retired.

"I told Mr. Rogers what Colonel Roosevelt had said. We had a half hour together and as he was leaving Mr. Rogers said: 'I shall be glad to have you consult with me at any time, but I want you to know that I consider that I must ever hold myself an unbiased commentator on public affairs. I cannot permit myself to let my reactions become prejudiced. Even though, personally, I am a Democrat, wherever I consider it in the public weal, I will be glad to co-operate with you; but when it seems to me that your party should be lambasted, I will join the Democrats against you, as quickly as I would criticize them if I felt they had it coming.'

"Will Rogers was little known then outside of certain circles in Manhattan. He was just coming. He had the courage in Colonel Roosevelt's office to candidly say what his attitude toward the Republicans would be under certain circumstances. And he showed that he meant to keep himself unbiased in so far as a man could. To that resolve he adhered throughout his life.

"It was the honesty of his opinion that was one of the greatest holds he had on the American people.

"What he said to me that day was not said in bombast, but with the modesty that always characterized him. At that time neither he nor I dreamed of the extent to which his voice would some day carry—but

Colonel Roosevelt prophetically appraised it.

"Only a week after Will Rogers' death, I was dining with Colonel Theodore Roosevelt, the second, and when Will Rogers' name came up he said to me: 'I want to tell you an interesting thing. I spent the evening with Will Rogers a few weeks ago and in talking of my father he told me of an incident

that happened when he first met you.'

"Colonel Roosevelt then repeated to me, word for word, as coming from Will Rogers to him a few weeks before, what I have recorded here that Rogers said to me in 1918."
