There was some feverish buying in the morning, although dull periods followed as profit taking appeared in some of the recent leaders. A number of "new signs" were recorded, however, and the close was fairly firm. Transfers approximated 3,000,000 shares.

Higher prices were still being talked of in the commission houses, and the continuance of out-of-town orders did much to keep trading volume on a paying basis.

Child Prodigy Mediocre In Scholastic Grades

SALT LAKE CITY, Nov. 15.—(UP)—Vernon King, widely known as the 13-year-old child prodigy, seems to be just an ordinary boy when it comes to making grades at school. When Salt Lake parents scanned monthly report cards today, Papa and Mama King found that their brilliant son had failed in chemistry, got a "C" in English and barely passed a "C" average in all his classes.

Yet the lad has astounded educators and university professors with his discovery of a fifth conjugation in Latin, apparent mastery of chemistry and physics, mathematical problems in the fourth dimension and similar feats of learning.

Vernon's favorite subject has always been chemistry and he has become adept at rattling off big long 30-letter words that confound the ordinary person along about the

third syllable. He can spell technical terms like orthocarbonybenzeneazodimethylaniline without batting an eyelash.

In all fairness to the boy, it must be added that he entered school this year a month late because of a broken leg received this summer. But a check on his grades during the last part of last year showed that he made a "C" average then, too.

His report card taken home today for signing listed an "E" for chemistry, "D" for copper, "A" for algebra, "C" for English, "A" for civics and "B" for hygiene.

Vernon is a junior in high school and made about the same scholastic marks as the average student. In everyday life, the boy is little different than his fellows.

NEW TYPE GASOLINE PRODUCED CHEAPLY; RATES HIGH OCTANE

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 15.—(AP)—A new type of gasoline costing 5 cents a gallon to produce and promising to increase the potential national gasoline resources by 25 per cent was described to the American Petroleum Institute here today.

This gasoline can be made from both the waste gases of oil refineries and from natural gas. The gases are converted into liquid gasoline by the chemical process known as polymerization.

Technically, under the process, little particles increase in size by joining together, so that gases may change into liquid and, if washed, liquids become solids.

The gasoline so made, chemists said, have octane ratings ranging between 78 and 110. The latter is better than the grades of gasoline which were available even in laboratories up to a few months ago, when the United States army produced the first 1,000 gallons of 100 octane fuel.

NEXT AUTO LICENSE BLACK ON ALUMINUM
