4 CCC OFFICERS DETAILED SOUTH

Those transferred to the Eureka district are Capt. Harold B. Elverson of Elk Creek; Lieut. William J. Anuskevics of Elk Creek, and Lieut. Robert S. Wolfsohn of Bradford.
