COL. ROOSEVELT'S SON NABBED BY OFFICERS FOR AIR GUN SNIPING

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Nov. 21.—(UP)—Cornelius Van S. Roosevelt, 20, son of Col. Theodore Roosevelt of New York, and a fellow student at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, were arrested last night after allegedly sniping at motorists with air pistols from the Six Club fraternity house.

The grandson of former President Theodore Roosevelt and his companions were arrested after lead slugs splattered off the metal parts of several cars, including one carrying two Metropolitan Park policemen. The two officers went to a third room floor, where Roosevelt and the other youth, Peter de Flores, were found by an open window.

They were charged with assault and battery with a dangerous weapon. Young Roosevelt made arrangements for securing bail of \$500 in a long distance talk with his father. After being locked up several hours they were released pending arraignment.

The arresting officers seized two pistols of English make. They fired slugs somewhat larger than those used in the ordinary air rifle.
