Comment on the Day's News

THESE questions are probably in your mind: What is this Canadian-American trade treaty, anyway? What will it do to us? Is it good? Or is it bad? What is all the shooting about?

YOU can't believe the politicians, for the Republicans are against it on general principles and the New Dealers are FOR IT on general principles.

WELL, let's see. People are inclined to vote pretty much according to their pocketbooks, you know. With that thought in mind, note this:

The National Grange, in session at Sacramento, CONDENSES the new treaty, and adopts a resolution calling upon the Roosevelt administration to RESCIND it.

Organized farmers, that is to say, are AGAINST it, because they think it will hurt them.

Shipping, banking and business leaders of the country, attending the national foreign trade council at Houston, Tex., give HIGH PRAISE to the new treaty and express the hope that others like it may be negotiated soon.

That means that the manufacturers are for it.

ALL of which confirms the belief, expressed in this column yesterday, that the agricultural and lumber West has been thrown to the sharks in order to make things better for the MANUFACTURING AND FINANCIAL East.

THIS new trade treaty, which cuts down the protecting tariff walls and invites foreigners to step into our markets and sell to us the very things we are hiring our own producers NOT TO PRODUCE is bad.

The method by which the treaty was made is WORSE.

IN THE past, in this free country, we have held to the principle that the man who is going to be HURT by some contemplated policy must be protected in the right to come in and tell his story.

In the making of this new treaty, that sound and just principle was cast overboard. The agricultural and lumbering West, which was to be sold down the river for the benefit of the industrial East, was never consulted. It wasn't even told what was IN THE TREATY until after it had been signed.

That is DICTATORSHIP in its fullest flower.

Nine persons were killed at Casenzano alone. Houses collapsed under the force of the wind.

Officials feared there might be a great loss from lightning strikes at sea. Ten persons were known to be killed at Serra San Bruno.
