What do you mean even have peanuts for dinner? The ideal dinner, I think, should include peanuts in one form or another, chopped peanuts in the salad, blanched peanuts in the hors d'oeuvres, peanut butter to spread on cracker, toast or bread.

In food value peanuts compare very favorably with bread or meat. Peanuts yield 2200 calories per pound, while bread yields just half and meat averages about one-third as many calories to the pound.
