OREGON REPUBLICAN IN COMING ELECTION STEWART PREDICTION

WASHINGTON, Dec. 4.—(AP)—Senator Stewart (R., Ore.) today predicted Oregon would be a strong Republican state in 1936.

The senator, who returned to Washington yesterday after about two months at home, took issue with a statement attributed to Postmaster General Parley that Oregon was one of the states the Democratic party considered safe.

Stewart said that while Oregon "takes its national politics calmly" the sentiment in the state was against the new deal.

"The Canadian trade agreement, the senator said, strengthened the Republican hold on the state. He said that not only was the lumber industry "harmed greatly" by the agreement, but also stock raisers will find it working to their detriment. In the lumber industry, he said, some operators may be forced to close their mills because they will be unable to compete with the low cost Canadian product. He added that there is a danger of wage reductions throughout the industry in the Pacific northwest because of the competition of Canadian lumber.

Stewart said that the Republican party in Oregon is not only strong, but also is well organized. He said that the party is well organized and is well equipped to meet the challenges of the coming election.
