WORLD AIR RACE BEING SPONSORED BY FRENCH CLUB

PARIS—(UP)—Organization of a round-the-world air race to be held in 1937 is being pushed by the Aero club of France as a sequel to the highly successful London-Melbourne race sponsored by the British.

The itinerary of the race, although it has not yet been fixed definitely pending further study, is expected to begin and end at Paris. The route most likely will lead through Cairo and follow the Far Eastern line from Egypt to Japan and thence northward to Siberia.

KINGDOM OF TONGA IS MODERN UTOPIA; POVERTY UNKNOWN

SYDNEY, N. S. W. (UP)—From her realm of a hundred tropic islands Queen Salote of Tonga, last independent state in the Pacific, has come to visit Sydney.

Queen Salote, who succeeded her father, King George Tubou II, was crowned in 1917, when she was only 18. Since then she has distinguished herself by deep religious principles, wisdom of governing and powers of oratory.

Arab villages, like Qalqaliya, are not quite so primitive. Windows, single-doored mud huts are the prevailing structures. Internal facilities consist usually of a wooden box and a little straw on the ground.

In Tel Aviv nearby, however, the Jews have surrounded themselves with most modern improvements. Red-tiled roofs on prosperous-looking houses form a distinct contrast to the Arab and Bedouin dwellings in the same general vicinity.
