

# MARTIN LOOSENS VIGOROUS BLAST AGAINST SENATE

"If all the farmers in Oregon had their little lights and their feed choppers running from Bonneville power it wouldn't make a dent in its output."

"We don't know a damned thing about the mineral resources of Oregon. We have 3,000 requests from those who want to develop the mineral resources, or use minerals, asking where they can be found in Oregon, and we can't tell them."

"Mining Bureau Lost  
I wanted a mining bureau established in Oregon to furnish that information and I worked like the devil to get the regular session to pass it. It didn't, and I made a hard fight for it in the special session."

"It went through the house all right, but when it got into the senate it got into the hands of an old-timer who always voted as his grand-paw did and who said he 'was a great supporter of the governor.'"

"To hell with such support. He had it referred to him so he could put it in his pocket, and he pulled it out in the last minutes of the session and killed it 20 to 7."

**Cites Flax Situation**  
Governor Martin said Oregon grows less flax now than in 1924.

"You go out and talk to these old farmers and they all have it in for Multnomah county and the Portland chamber of commerce. We went out to get help for the flax industry and they cut us down in the legislature to \$1,000."

"Ask them why and they say 'high taxes.' When you stop to remember that the tax bill is about \$11,000,000 you can see how that \$1,000 is liable to cause some farmers to lose their farms."

Edgar Freed, state director of the emergency council, called for reports from the various federal agencies represented.

"I don't want you to think I am saying anything against the Oregon people," Governor Martin concluded. "They are the finest in the world."

## Chicken Appetite Disappears After Swallowing Bone

OAKLAND, Cal., Dec. 5. (AP)—Mrs. Myrtle Blaker, 32, doesn't want any chicken for Christmas dinner.  
She had one for Thanksgiving, and it took the doctors nearly a week to get a three-inch bone out of her throat.  
She said the 16-inch "esophagoscope" they used to extract the bone was as hard to swallow as it sounds. The doctors, however, were pleased. They said it was the third time the new instrument had been employed.

## SENATOR NORRIS TO SUPPORT F. R. WHEN NOMINATED

WASHINGTON, Dec. 5. (AP)—Senator George W. Norris today pledged his support to President Roosevelt's re-election, but announced that he himself will "not seek renomination."

The senator's carefully phrased statement confirmed previous reports of friends that if Norris ran next year he would run as an independent. But the senatorial veteran declined to comment on a move in Nebraska to draft him as an independent.

The statement of Norris, an independent Republican:

"I believe President Roosevelt deserves re-election and I expect to support him actively, regardless of party consideration. I can perform this duty more effectively if I am not the candidate for senator of any political party."

"I will therefore not seek renomination, and will not be a candidate in the primary."

## Bonneville Damage Award Is Upheld

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 5. (AP)—The ninth federal circuit court turned down a government appeal today from a \$5,750 damage award to owners of a railroad right-of-way which is to be flooded by the impounded waters of Bonneville dam.  
The amount must be paid to Mildred S. and Waldo A. Alcorn and to

the West Coast Power company for 2.58 acres of land along the power company's tracts in Oregon.
