71 BELOW ZERO AT FT. YUKON; RECORD COLD OVER ALASKA

FAIRBANKS, Alaska, Dec. 7.—(AP)—Record breaking cold gripped interior Alaska today.

Fort Yukon, Alaska, on the upper Yukon, reported 71 below zero today, lowest December reading in the recorded history of the 61-year-old trading post.

Fairbanks' 89 degrees below zero last night equaled its previous December record of 1912.

Circle City reported 60 below; Big Delta, 58 below, and Eagle and Dawson, 52 below last night.

All readings were from official government thermometers.

At Nome, on the Bering seacoast, the mercury was comparatively high, registering zero. This fact, coupled with the abnormally low reading inland, indicated there that the intense cold wave was coming straight from the north pole.

Disturbances off coast and mild weather at Barrow, on the Arctic rim, indicated the cold wave may break in a day or two.

GRANT WATER FOR MINES IN COUNTY

SALEM, Ore., Dec. 7.—(AP)—The state game commission at Portland filed application with the state engineer for a permit to appropriate 10 second feet of water from Rock creek, tributary of the North Umpqua river, for fish propagation in Douglas county.

Other applications included: Glenn M. Young, Jacksonville, for two second feet from Steve Oster creek, for placer mining in Jackson county.

Martin J. Love, Jacksonville, for one second foot from a spring, tributary of the Applegate river, for domestic purposes in Josephine county.

W. F. Wright, Rogue River, for one second foot from Tom East creek and Black canyon for milling purposes in Josephine county.

HOLIDAY BUYING BEST IN YEARS

Holiday shoppers, in a merry buying mood, rushed retail stores throughout the nation last week for the start of what merchants predict may be the greatest Christmas season of years.

Industrial progress kept pace with retail trade. Smoking factories, crashing looms, the clang of heavy hammers resounded as the Associated Press index of industrial activity touched the highest point since July, 1930.

The index, adjusted for seasonal variation, stood at 86 per cent of the 1929-1930 average.

From the 20th through the 15th shopping day before Christmas, practically every section of the country experienced the benefits of the expanded buying wave.

BRITAIN SHROUDED IN FOG BLANKET

LONDON, Dec. 7.—(AP)—The entire British Isles, except for a small part of Wales, was blanketed today by the first general heavy fog of winter.

Air service was cancelled, forcing foreign secretary Sir Samuel Hoare to arrange to go by boat and train to Paris instead of by plane for his conference with Premier Laval.
