There is a circus in full swing here, with the inevitable man on the flying trapeze, galluping white horses in the rings, clowns cutting up capers and dogs jumping through hoops.

Such attractions add to the Christmas spirit and the gaiety of the occasion, but we seriously question their practical value. Before most of the best window shows there are such crowds now, it is hard to get near the entrances much less through them.
