Company A, 186th Infantry, placed 11th among Oregon National Guard units in the annual Pershing award competition on the 30 calibre rifle range. It scored 6135 merit points out of a maximum of 6400 for a rating of 80.2 per cent.

On the automatic rifle range Company A ranked eighth among state units, scoring 524 merit points out of a maximum of 1100 for a rating of 76 per cent.

Headquarters company, 3rd battalion, of which Lieut. J. W. Orisby is commander, was in a three-way tie for second place in the 30 calibre rifle shooting, scoring 5824 merit points out of 6400, to get a rating of 91 per cent.
