Coach Bill Bowerman's basketball charges will turn out tonight to begin the season grind, with still but little hint as to the available material for the squad. Stan Kunzman and Bob Smith, regulars last year, will probably not see action at all this year. Both graduate at mid-year, after only two games have been played. It would hardly be worth the effort to practice for a month, and then get in only two struggles, so the two will probably not even turn out.

The move to play each team in the southern Oregon circuit four times during the season is going to hike the attendance here, if signs mean anything. In the past, the games that brought the biggest houses were those games with Grants Pass, Ashland, and Klamath Falls, with the Chemawa Indians also being Medford favorites. With a football season that showed nothing phenomenal in gate receipts, a healthy showing at the box office during the net season will take a few of the faces of the school business managers.

Of the 17 members already listed on the Oregon State basketball roster, only three are under six feet. Arthur Merryman of Corvallis being the shortest man with a height of five feet, ten inches. The tallest man on the squad, Clifford Polen of Portland, towers up into the stratosphere for six feet, seven inches. Coach "Blitz" Gill may teach his men to stretch their shots properly by trying to shoot over Polen's head, although there has been no official announcement of this.

To date Oregon State has 22 games signed, starting against Union Oil at Portland on December 20, and ending up against Washington at Seattle on March 7. By the time the Beavers have romped up and down the maple planks that long, they'll only be about five feet tall, one would imagine.

### CALIFORNIA NEEDS PREP SCHOOL AGES

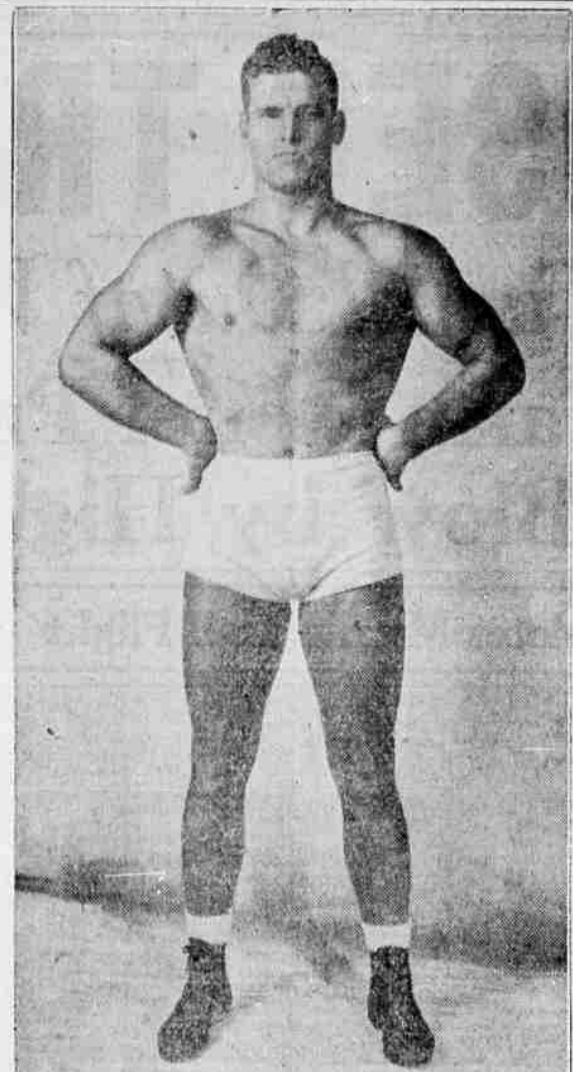
